INDIVIDUALS IN ATTENDANCE:

BACKGROUND:

The City Administration has been working alongside A&J Realty Services, the Developers of the former Wyandotte Post Office located at 166 Oak Street. The Developer proposes to demolish northern portions of the former Post Office in Downtown Wyandotte and construct an additional 13,673 square feet of commercial retail space to add to the existing 15,078 square feet. As a second phase, four floors of residential space totaling 63,661 square feet will be built atop the first floor. The project is estimated to cost \$14 million and will result in approximately 33 new condominiums and 16 apartment units.

On April 15th, 2019 the City Assessor submitted a Statement of Obsolescence to the Michigan State Tax Commission which outlines the extent and significance of functional obsolescence of the property i.e. lack of modern electrical, plumbing, and mechanical systems; poor conditions of the walls, floors, ceiling; and inefficient windows and door systems. Therefore, in addition to qualifying for Brownfield Redevelopment tax reimbursement, this property also qualifies for the Obsolete Property Rehabilitation Act. The first step for the developer to acquire this exemption is for City Council to establish the Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District

STRATEGIC PLAN/GOALS:

As stated in the DDA's Mission Statement, "The Wyandotte Downtown Development Authority shall initiate and coordinate downtown development through design, business recruitment, promotion and the effective use of private and public space for an attractive, festive downtown atmosphere."

ACTION REQUESTED:

The DDA Director is requesting the Mayor and City Council to establish the Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District for the property at 166 Oak Street.

The Act provides property tax exemptions for commercial and commercial housing properties that are rehabilitated and meet the requirements of the Act. Properties must meet eligibility requirements including a statement of obsolescence by the local assessor. The property must be located in an established Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District. Exemptions are approved for a term of 1-12 years as determined by the local unit of government. The property taxes for the rehabilitated property are based on the previous year's (prior to rehabilitation) taxable value. The taxable value is frozen for the duration of the exemption.

RESOLUTION by Councilman______

WHEREAS, pursuant to PA 146 of 2000, the City of Wyandotte is a Qualified Local Governmental Unit eligible to establish one or more Obsolete Property Rehabilitation Districts; and

WHEREAS, the City Council legally established the Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District 166 Oak Street on September 23, 2019, after a public hearing held on September 23, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the taxable value of the property proposed to be exempt plus the aggregate taxable value of property already exempt under Public Act 146 of 2000 and under Public Act 198 of 1974 (IFT's) does not exceed 5% of the total taxable value of the City of Wyandotte; and

WHEREAS, the application was approved at a public hearing as provided by section 4(2) of Public Act 146 of 2000 on (date); and

WHEREAS, the (applicant) is not delinquent in any taxes related to the facility; and

WHEREAS, the application is for obsolete property as defined in section 2(h) of Public Act 146 of 2000; and

WHEREAS, the applicant A&J Realty Ventures, LLC. has provided answers to all required questions under the application instructions to the City of Wyandotte; and

WHEREAS, the City of Wyandotte requires that rehabilitation of the facility shall be completed by August 2020; and

WHEREAS, the commencement of the rehabilitation of the facility did not occur before the establishment of the Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District; and

WHEREAS, the application relates to a rehabilitation program that when completed constitutes a rehabilitated facility within the meaning of Public Act 146 of 2000 and that is situated within an Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District established in the City of Wyandotte eligible under Public Act 146 of 2000 to establish such a district; and

WHEREAS, completion of the rehabilitated facility is calculated to, and will at the time of issuance of the certificate, have the reasonable likelihood to increase commercial activity, create employment, revitalize an urban area, and increase the number of residents in the community in which the facility is situated; and

WHEREAS, the rehabilitation includes improvements aggregating 10% or more of the true cash value of the property at commencement of the rehabilitation as provided by section 2(l) of Public Act 146 of 2000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Wyandotte be and hereby is granted an Obsolete Property Rehabilitation Exemption for the real property, excluding land, located in Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District No. 13 at 166 Oak Street for a period of 12 years, beginning December 31, (year STC approves), and ending December 30, (up to twelve years after beginning date), pursuant to the provisions of PA 146 of 2000, as amended.

Please accept this letter as a request for an Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District (OPRD) and Obsolete Property Rehabilitation Act (OPRA) Certificate for the property located at 166 Oak Street, Wyandotte, Michigan 48192, which is referred to herein as the "Property" and described on Attachment A. The Property will be rehabilitated by the petitioner and current owner, A&J Realty Ventures, LLC.

Company and Project Synopsis

A&J Realty Ventures, LLC or any affiliate, or such other developer are collectively the project developer ("Developer"). Jason D'Herin is the President and C.E.O. of A&J Realty Ventures, LLC. As a local to Wyandotte, D'Herin has a plethora of development experience in his local community. He has served as the President of D&R Investments and D&R Maintenance Management, Inc for 27 and 18 years, respectively. Mr. D'Herin is also the owner and developer of the Waterfront Wyandotte, an upscale restaurant and lounge. The proposed project outlined within this plan is part of A&J Realty Ventures continued efforts to invest and further expand within the city and southeast Michigan.

The proposed OPRD contains one parcel, totaling approximately 0.869 acres with a street address of 166 Oak Street. The Property is roughly bounded by property lines to the north, the property line to the east, Oak Street to the south, and 2nd street to the west. The OPRD is located in Wyandotte's Central Business District. The property is occupied by a 1-story former post office totaling approximately 15,000 square feet. The building is currently vacant and has been since 2014. A March 2019 inspection by the City of Wyandotte Assessor's Office identified the property as Functionally Obsolete due to a lack of modern electrical, plumbing, and mechanical systems, as well as poor conditions of the walls, floors, ceiling, and inefficient windows and door systems.

The 166 Oak redevelopment includes demolition of the north side of the current post office building. A 77,334 square foot, four story addition will be added on to the building to total approximately 92,412 square feet. Approximately 13,673 square feet will be added onto the ground floor in order to provide space for six retail units, enclosed podium parking, and a residential lobby. This addition will total less than 50% of the existing building footprint.

The request for the OPRA Certificate is specifically for the proposed first floor commercial use and enclosed podium parking that will total approximately 13,673 square feet. The first floor will include commercial tenant suites, a residential lobby, property management offices, mailboxes and parcel room, bicycle storage, and podium parking.

While not subject to the OPRA request, a community room will be located on the second floor to accommodate a lounge area with a kitchenette and fitness equipment. From the community room, an outdoor pool space complete with lounge chairs, landscaping, and an outdoor kitchenette are accessible. The existing utilities including electrical and water, and sewer will be relocated and upgraded, as well as relocation of traffic signals and improvements to the public alley located between the parcels. Furthermore, new lighting, flooring, modern finishes, and repairs to the building structure and foundation will be implemented as needed.

The Necessity for Tax Relief

Substantial investment is necessary to rehabilitate the area into a viable, long-term development. The property requires a partial demolition and additional foundational support to support the upper levels. The overall internal rate of return for the proposed development will be extremely low without the receipt of the Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District (and Certificate), and therefore, the development would not be possible without it. The costs associated with the rehabilitation require that the operating costs of the proposed renovations and redevelopment of the project need to be kept as low as possible (including property taxes).

The proposed Development included within the request will result in approximately 30 construction jobs and 10 full-time equivalent (FTE) jobs associated with the ongoing management and maintenance for the proposed residential development. Based on the commercial square footage, an additional 50-70 jobs are anticipated to be created by tenants.

PA 146 Request

A 12-year abatement is being requested.

Economic Advantages of the Rehabilitation

Upon completion, the Development will return an obsolete property to productive use and will increase residential and commercial density in in the central business district of downtown Wyandotte. Activation of this property will provide additional daytime and evening foot traffic to patronize local businesses and expand the commercial nature of the downtown district. In addition, the project provides improvements to the pedestrian environment by improving the public right of way along Oak Street with enhanced streetscapes.

The granting of the OPRA tax abatement will not result in any fewer taxes to the City of Wyandotte in the short-term or long-term. On a short-term basis approximately 30 construction jobs will be created. Upon successful redevelopment, the proposed redevelopment associated with the Development will create approximately 10 full-time equivalent (FTE) jobs related to the management and maintenance of the property. These new jobs, along with the new residents living at the development, will spur additional economic viability for the City of Wyandotte.

Following expiration of the 12-year abatement the building will deliver a significant increase in tax revenue. Over time, the successful redevelopment and cultural growth will have a city-wide impact.

General Description

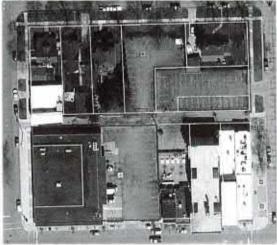
The proposed Development is located at 166 Oak Street in the Central Business District of Wyandotte. The Property is generally bound by the property line to the north, the property line to the east, Oak Street to the south, and 2nd street to the west. The property consists of one parcel, originally part of a larger 2 parcel project, which is outlined in the map below.

The Property has historically been occupied as a post office building. The associated addresses and parcel identification numbers can be found below and a copy of the corresponding legal description can be found at the end of this attachment.

The 166 Oak redevelopment includes demolition of the north side of the current post office building. A 77,334 square foot, four story addition will be added on to the building to total approximately 92,412 square feet. Approximately 13,673 square feet will be added onto the ground floor in order to provide space for six retail units, enclosed podium parking, and a residential lobby. This addition will total *less than* 50% of the existing building footprint.

The request for the OPRA Certificate is specifically for the proposed first floor commercial use and enclosed podium parking that will total approximately 13,673 square feet. The first floor will include commercial tenant suites, a residential lobby, property management offices, mailboxes and parcel room, bicycle storage, and podium parking.





Description of Proposed Use

The proposed redevelopment will create additional commercial density that has been needed within the Wyandotte downtown for years. The 166 Oak Street development will entail the partial demolition, rehabilitation of the current building. The brick and pre-cast concrete associated with the post office building will be retained, while new storefront systems will be installed along Oak Street, including the new addition to the east.

Separate from the first floor and this OPRA request, approximately 49 residential apartment and condo units will be created. The second floor will contain 16 apartment units which will be offered in 2 studios (averaging 500 square feet each), 12 one-bedroom (averaging 728 square feet each),



and 2 two-bedroom (averaging 944 square feet each) layouts. Floors three through five will contain condo units, divided into 12 one-bedroom units each with its own multi-purpose room and 21 two-bedroom units. These three upper floors total 47,865 square feet and units range from 916 to 1,441 square feet. Each unit will include modern, high end finishes, open floor plans with exposed brick walls and ceiling joists. On the second level, a community space leads to a rooftop pool deck, complete with lounge chairs, landscaping, and an outdoor kitchenette to provide a relaxing space for residents to enjoy.

Nature and Extent of the Rehabilitation

Significant investment is required to make the building fit for occupancy.

As part of the rehabilitation included within this OPRA request, the building will receive new utilities including electrical and plumbing, new energy efficient heating, cooling and ventilation systems new energy efficient windows and doors, and construction of balconies. Repairs to the building structure and facade will be completed as needed to honor the building's historic appearance. The structure will also be brought up to code per ADA and Fire requirements, which will include elevator service and fire suppression/alarm system.

This development are necessary components crucial to attracting resident and visitor interest along with investment in this blighted area of Wyandotte.

The City of Wyandotte has locally adopted the Act as May 7th, 2001, which was enacted to provide means for local units of government to facilitate the revitalization and redevelopment of functionally obsolete properties. The City Assessor has transmitted the OPRA Application to the City Council for review and approval.

The Act provides property tax exemptions for commercial and commercial housing properties that are rehabilitated and meet the requirements of the Act. Properties must meet eligibility requirements including a statement of obsolescence by the local assessor. The property must be located in an established Obsolete Property Rehabilitation District. Exemptions are approved for a term of 1-12 years as determined by the local unit of government. The property taxes for the rehabilitated property are based on the previous year's (prior to rehabilitation) taxable value. The taxable value is frozen for the duration of the exemption.

INDIVIDUALS IN ATTENDANCE:

BACKGROUND:

The City Administration has been working alongside A&J Realty Services, the Developers of the former Wyandotte Post Office located at 166 Oak Street. The Developer proposes to demolish northern portions of the former Post Office in Downtown Wyandotte and construct an additional 13,673 square feet of commercial retail space to add to the existing 15,078 square feet. As a second phase, four floors of residential space totaling 63,661 square feet will be built atop the first floor. The project is estimated to cost \$14 million and will result in approximately 33 new condominiums and 16 apartment units.

This property qualifies as a brownfield because it was used for a commercial purpose and was determined to be functionally obsolete. To assist with addressing the brownfield conditions and associated redevelopment costs, the Developer is requesting reimbursement for activities in an amount not to exceed \$4,458,557.

The project is also seeking the approval of an Obsolete Property Rehabilitation Act (OPRA) tax abatement and Neighborhood Enterprise Zone (NEZ) tax abatement. The Brownfield Plan originally projected a 15-year NEZ, but has since revised the NEZ to 12 years. The project is located within the boundaries of the Downtown Development Authority (DDA) and capture for Brownfield Tax Increment Financing shall be governed in accordance with the Interlocal Agreement established between the DDA and Wyandotte Brownfield Redevelopment Authority (WBRA). Following the expiration of the OPRA and NEZ tax abatements, a 20% pass-through to local taxing units is calculated per the Interlocal Agreement. Capture of two school millages – Local School Operating and the State Education Tax – will require further approval of the Brownfield Plan and Act 381 Work Plan by the Michigan Economic Development Corporation, Michigan Strategic Fund and the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality. The Developer Reimbursement Agreement is scheduled for review and approval by the WBRA on October 15th, 2019.

STRATEGIC PLAN/GOALS:

As stated in the DDA's Mission Statement, "The Wyandotte Downtown Development Authority shall initiate and coordinate downtown development through design, business recruitment, promotion and the effective use of private and public space for an attractive, festive downtown atmosphere."

ACTION REQUESTED:

The DDA Director is requesting the Mayor and City Council to approve the Brownfield Redevelopment Plan No. 22

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS & ACCOUNT NUMBER:

20% of the future tax increment revenue will be captured by the DDA following the OPRA and NEZ Abatements until the DDA Charter sunsets in 2034.

Additionally, an annual WBRA administrative fee will be allocated in the amount equal to 12.5% of the annual Tax Increment Revenue (TIR) levied from the local millages, in an amount not to exceed \$5,000 annually for the duration of the Plan.

IMPLEMENTATION PLAN:

DDA Director, City Administrator, City Engineer and City Attorney to jointly execute the entire Brownfield Plan.

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE AND PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF CITY OF WYANDOTTE CABLE SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF ACT 94, PUBLIC ACTS OF MICHIGAN, 1933, AS AMENDED **PURPOSES** OF **PAYING COSTS** OF FOR THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION, IMPROVEMENT, ENLARGEMENT, EXTENSION OR REPAIR OF THE CITY OF WYANDOTTE CABLE SYSTEM; TO PROVIDE FOR THE COLLECTION OF REVENUES FROM THE SYSTEM SUFFICIENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE COSTS OF OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE SYSTEM AND TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE SEGREGATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF SYSTEM REVENUES; TO PROVIDE FOR THE RETIREMENT AND SECURITY OF THE BONDS HEREIN AUTHORIZED AND THE RIGHTS OF THE HOLDERS OF THE BONDS IN ENFORCEMENT THEREOF; AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS.

THE CITY OF WYANDOTTE ORDAINS:

- Section 1. <u>Definitions</u>. All terms not defined herein shall have the meanings set forth in this Ordinance, and whenever used in this Ordinance, except when otherwise indicated by the context, the following terms shall have the following meanings:
- (a) "acquire," "acquiring" and "acquired" shall include acquisition by purchase, construction or any other method.
- (b) "Act 94" means the Revenue Bond Act of 1933, Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended.
- (c) "Additional Bonds" means any additional bonds of equal standing with the Series 2019 Bonds and any other outstanding Senior Lien Bonds issued pursuant to Section 21 of this Ordinance.

(d) "Aggregate Debt Service" for any period means, as of any date of calculation by the City, the sum of the amounts of the debt service for such period with respect to all Outstanding Senior Lien Bonds. In the event that any of the Outstanding Senior Lien Bonds bear interest at a variable rate, each such series of variable rate Bonds shall, for purposes of calculating Aggregate Debt Service, be assumed by the City to be the rate established for such computation in writing by the General Manager; provided, however, that such assumed rate shall not be less than the average rate borne by such variable rate Bonds during the twelve full calendar months immediately preceding the date on which such computation is made; and provided further, however, that, to the extent such variable rate Bonds have not been Outstanding during the entirety of such twelve month period, the assumed rate shall not be less than the average rate on the SIFMA Index during such twelve month period.

- (e) "Aggregate Debt Service Requirement" means for any period, and as of any date of calculation, Aggregate Debt Service for such period, less any capitalized interest to be paid from the proceeds of the Bonds.
- (f) "Bond Insurer" means a municipal bond insurance provider which is insuring any Outstanding Bonds or providing an insurance policy or surety bond to secure the Bond Reserve Account.
- (g) "Bond Reserve Account" means the Bond Reserve Account of the Redemption Account established pursuant to Section 13(B) of this Ordinance.
- (h) "Bond Reserve Requirement" means an amount, if any, determined by agreement between the City and any purchaser of any series of Bonds, but in any event not-to-exceed the lesser of (a) the maximum annual debt service requirements on the Outstanding Bonds, (b) 125% of the average annual debt service requirements on the Outstanding Bonds, or (c) the total of 10% of the original aggregate face amount of each series of the Outstanding Bonds, reduced by the net original issue discount, if any; provided, however, that the Reserve Requirement shall not at any time exceed the amount allowed to be invested at an unrestricted yield pursuant to Treas. Reg. Section 1.148-2(f)(2) or any successor provision thereto as applicable to the Bonds. For purposes of the Bond Reserve Requirement annual debt service on any variable rate Bonds shall not, after the issuance of such variable rate Bonds, be adjusted because of an adjustment to the interest rate borne by such variable rate Bonds.
- (i) "Bonds" means the Series 2019 Bonds, any Additional Bonds, and any Junior Lien Bonds.
 - (j) "City" means the City of Wyandotte, Wayne County, Michigan.
- (k) "Commission" means the Municipal Service Commission created and established by Chapter VII of the Charter of the City.
- (l) "Consulting Engineers" means the engineer or engineering firm or firms appointed from time to time, and having a favorable reputation for skill and experience in the design and operation of municipal telecommunications and cable utilities at the time retained by the Commission to perform the acts and carry out the duties provided for such Consulting Engineers in this Ordinance.
 - (m) "Council" or "City Council" means the City Council of the City.
- (n) "Event of Default" shall refer to one of the Events of Default specified in Section 22 of this Ordinance.
- (o) "General Manager" means the General Manager of the City's Department of Municipal Services.
- (p) "Government Obligations" means (1) direct obligations of (including obligations issued or held in book entry form on the books of) the United States of America, (2) obligations the payment on which is guaranteed by the United States of America including, but not limited to, stripped interest components of obligations issued by the Resolution Funding Corporation (REFCORP) and non-callable, non-prepayable debt obligations of the United States Agency for International Development (US AID), which pay principal and interest at least three business days prior to any respective escrow requirement dates, or (3) non-callable, senior debt obligations of any government-sponsored enterprise or federal agency, corporation, or instrumentality of the United States of America created by an act of congress including, but not limited to, the Federal Home Loan Banks, Freddie Mac, Federal Farm Credit Banks Funding Corporation, and Fannie Mae.

- (q) "Internal Revenue Code" means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
- (r) "Investment Obligations" means to the extent authorized by law, and if provided by an investment policy duly adopted by the City, one or more of the following: (1) bonds, securities and other obligations of the United States or an agency or instrumentality of the United States; (2) certificates of deposit, savings accounts, deposit accounts, or depository receipts of a Financial Institution who is eligible to be a depository of funds belonging to the State; (3) commercial paper rated at the time of purchase within the two highest classifications established by not less than two nationally recognized rating services and that matures not more than 270 days after the date of purchase; repurchase agreements consisting of instruments listed in subdivision (1) above; (4) bankers' acceptances of United States banks; (5) obligations of this State or any of its political subdivisions that at the time of purchase are rated as investment grade by not less than one nationally recognized rating service; (6) mutual funds registered under the investment company act of 1940, title I of chapter 686, 54 Stat. 789, 15 U.S.C. 80a-1 to 80a-3 and 80a-4 to 80a-64, with authority to purchase only investments that are legal for direct investment by a public corporation; (7) investment pools organized under the surplus funds investment pool act, 1982 PA 367, MCL 129.111 to 129.118; and (8) investment pools organized under the local government investment pool act, 1985 PA 121, MCL 129.141 to 129.150.
- (s) "Junior Lien Bonds" means bonds, bond anticipation notes issued under Act 34, Public Acts of Michigan, 2001, as amended, or other obligations which may be issued or incurred by the City to provide funds for any lawful purpose of the System which are of junior standing and priority of lien with respect to the Net Revenues to the claim of the Senior Lien Bonds.
- (t) "Municipal Obligations" means any bonds or other obligations of any state of the United States of America or of any agency, instrumentality or local governmental unit of any such state (1) which are not callable at the option of the obligor prior to maturity or as to which irrevocable notice has been given by the obligor to call on the date specified in the notice, and (2) which are fully secured as to principal and interest and redemption premium, if any, by a fund consisting only of cash or Government Obligations, which fund may be applied only to the payment of such principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on such bonds or other obligations on the maturity date or dates thereof or the specified redemption date or dates pursuant to such irrevocable instructions, as appropriate, and (3) which fund is sufficient, as verified by an independent certified public accountant, to pay principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on the bonds or other obligations described in this definition of Municipal Obligation on the maturity date or dates thereof or on the redemption date or dates specified in the irrevocable instructions referred to in subclause (1) of this definition of Municipal Obligation, as appropriate, and (4) which are rated, based on the escrow, in the highest rating category of either two of the following three ratings agencies: Standard & Poor's Corporation, Fitch Ratings, and Moody's Investors Service, Inc. or any successors thereto.
- (u) "Net Revenues" means the Revenues remaining after deducting the reasonable expenses of administration, operation, and maintenance of the System, and shall be construed as defined in Section 3 of Act 94.
- (v) "Operation and Maintenance Account" means the Operation and Maintenance Account established pursuant to Section 13(A) of this Ordinance.
- (w) "Ordinance" means this Ordinance and any other ordinance amendatory or supplemental hereto.
 - (x) "Outstanding Bonds" means Bonds issued and delivered under this Ordinance except:
 - (1) Bonds canceled by the Transfer Agent;
 - (2) Bonds (or portions of Bonds) for the payment or redemption of which moneys or Government Obligations, equal to the principal amount or redemption price thereof, as the case may be, with interest to the date of maturity or redemption date, shall be held in trust under this Ordinance and set aside for such payment or redemption (whether at or prior to the maturity or redemption date), provided that if such Bonds (or portion of Bonds) are to be redeemed, notice of redemption shall have been given as provided in this Ordinance or provision satisfactory to the Transfer Agent shall have been made for the giving of such notice;

(3) Bonds in lieu of or in substitution for which other Bonds shall have been authenticated and delivered; and

- (4) Bonds no longer deemed to be Outstanding Bonds as provided in Section 7 of this Ordinance.
- (y) "Project" means the Series 2019 Project and any additional acquisition, construction, improvement, enlargement, extension or repair of the System to be acquired and constructed pursuant to this Ordinance.

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- (z) "Rebate Account" means the Rebate Account established pursuant to Section 14 of this Ordinance.
- (aa) "Receiving Fund" means the Receiving Fund established pursuant to Section 13 of this Ordinance.
- (bb) "Redemption Account" means the Bond and Interest Redemption Account established pursuant to Section 13(B) of this Ordinance.
- (cc) "Registered Owner" means the owner of a Bond as shown by the registration records as kept by the Transfer Agent.
- (dd) "Replacement Account" means the Replacement and Improvement Account established pursuant to Section 13(E) of this Ordinance.
- (ee) "Revenues" means the income derived from the rates charged for the services, facilities, and commodities furnished by the System and shall be construed as defined in Section 3 of Act 94. Revenues shall include earnings on investment of funds and accounts of the System required to be deposited in the Receiving Fund pursuant to this Ordinance and other revenues derived from or pledged to operation of the System.
- (ff) "Senior Lien Bonds" means the Series 2019 Bonds, while they remain outstanding, and any Additional Bonds.
- (gg) "Series 2019 Bonds" means the Cable System Revenue Bonds, Series 2019 authorized by Section 4 of this Ordinance. If the Series 2019 Bonds are sold in two or more series then the term "Series 2019 Bonds" shall be construed to refer to both series.
- (hh) "Series 2019 Construction Fund" means the Cable System Revenue Bonds Series 2019 Construction Fund created under Section 19 of this Ordinance.
- (ii) "Series 2019 Project" refers to improvements to the System including, but not limited to, acquisition and equipping of a new head end facility, acquisition and installation of fiber-to-the-home (FTTH) infrastructure, and other approved improvements, together with any appurtenances and attachments thereto and any related site improvements.
- (jj) "Sufficient" means with respect to (1) cash or (2) Government Obligations or (3) Municipal Obligations, or any combination thereof, not redeemable at the option of the issuer thereof, the principal and interest payments upon which, without reinvestment of the interest, come due at such times and in such amounts, as to be fully sufficient to pay the interest as it comes due on the Bonds or any portion thereof and the principal and redemption premium, if any, on the Bonds or any portion thereof as they come due whether on the stated maturity date or upon earlier redemption. Securities representing such obligations or cash shall be placed in trust with a bank or trust company, and if any of the Bonds are to be called for redemption prior to maturity, irrevocable instructions to call the Bonds for redemption shall be given to the Transfer Agent.
- (kk) "System" means the complete Wyandotte Municipal Services Cable and Telecommunications system of the City, an approved cable television and cable communication system under Act 94 established by the City before January 1, 1987, including all cable television, internet operations and other telecommunication systems units, plants, works, instrumentalities and properties, together with the Series 2019 Project and all additions, extensions and improvements existing or hereafter acquired.
- (ll) "Transfer Agent" means the transfer agent and bond registrar for any series of Bonds as appointed from time to time by the City for payment of the Bonds.
- (mm) "Trustee" means a bank or trust company named by the City to serve as Trustee pursuant to this Ordinance upon occurrence of an Event of Default pursuant to Section 32 of this Ordinance.

Section 2. <u>Necessity; Approval of Plans and Specifications</u>. It is hereby determined to be necessary for the public health and welfare of the City to acquire the Series 2019 Project in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore prepared which plans and specifications are hereby approved.

Section 3. Costs of Series 2019 Project; Useful Life. The aggregate cost of the Series 2019 Project is estimated to be not-to-exceed Twelve Million Dollars (\$12,000,000), including the payment of legal, engineering, financial and other expenses incident thereto and incident to the issuance and sale of the Series 2019 Bonds, which estimate of cost is hereby approved and confirmed. The cost of the Series 2019 Project includes deposit of monies to the Bond Reserve Account, if necessary to meet the Bond Reserve Requirement, and capitalized interest, if any, in an amount to be determined at the time of sale by the General Manager. The period of usefulness of the Series 2019 Project is estimated to be not less than thirty (30) years.

Section 4. <u>Series 2019 Bonds Authorized</u>. The City shall issue the Series 2019 Bonds pursuant to the provisions of Act 94 in one or more series in the aggregate principal amount of not-to-exceed Twelve Million Dollars (\$12,000,000) as finally determined at the time of sale, for the purposes of paying the costs of acquiring and constructing the Series 2019 Project, including payment of legal, engineering, financial and other expenses incident thereto and incident to the issuance and sale of the Series 2019 Bonds, capitalized interest, if any, in an amount to be determined at the time of sale by the General Manager, and deposit of monies to the Bond Reserve Account if necessary to meet the Bond Reserve Requirement. The Series 2019 Bonds shall not be a general obligation of the City but shall be payable solely out of the Net Revenues of the System. The General Manager is hereby authorized to determine, based upon the advice of bond counsel and the Municipal Advisor, whether to sell a portion of the Series 2019 Bonds as taxable bonds.

Section 5. <u>Series 2019 Bond Data</u>. The Series 2019 Bonds shall be designated as the CABLE SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2019, with any additional designations as determined by the General Manager to distinguish tax-exempt and taxable bonds. The Series 2019 Bonds shall be issued as term bonds or serial bonds as determined at the time of sale of the Series 2019 Bonds, in fully-registered form in denominations of \$100,000 or any integral multiple of \$5,000 in excess of \$100,000 not exceeding for each maturity the maximum principal amount of such maturity, or, if acceptable to the purchaser of the Bonds, may be issued in the form of a single fully-registered, nonconvertible bond of the denomination of the principal sum issued. The Series 2019 Bonds shall be dated as of such date as may be determined at the time of sale, and shall mature either annually or semi-annually on such dates as shall be determined at the time of sale, provided, however, that the Series 2019 Bonds shall mature in not-to-exceed 20 annual or 40 semi-annual installments.

The Series 2019 Bonds shall bear interest at the rate or rates to be determined at the time of sale of the Series 2019 Bonds, payable April 1, 2020, or such other date as approved at the time of sale thereof, and semi-annually thereafter by check drawn on the Transfer Agent and mailed to the registered owner at the registered address, as shown on the registration books of the City maintained by the Transfer Agent. Interest shall be payable to the registered owner of record as of the fifteenth day of the month prior to the payment date for each interest payment. The date of determination of registered owner for purposes of payment of interest as provided in this paragraph may be changed by the City to conform to market practice in the future. The principal of the Series 2019 Bonds shall be payable at the designated office of the Transfer Agent.

The Series 2019 Bonds may be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the times and prices finally determined at the time of sale. In the event that any of the Series 2019 Bonds shall be issued as term bonds, the mandatory redemption requirements for such term bonds shall be specified at the time of sale.

Unless waived by any registered owner of bonds to be redeemed, official notice of redemption shall be given by the Transfer Agent on behalf of the City. Such notice shall be dated and shall contain at a minimum the following information: original issue date; maturity dates; interest rates; CUSIP numbers, if any; certificate numbers (and in the case of partial redemption) the called amounts of each certificate; the place where the bonds called for redemption are to be surrendered for payment; and that

interest on the bonds or portions thereof called for redemption shall cease to accrue from and after the redemption date.

In addition, further notice shall be given by the Transfer Agent in such manner as may be required or suggested by regulations or market practice at the applicable time, but no defect in such further notice nor any failure to give all or any portion of such further notice shall in any manner defeat the effectiveness of a call for redemption if notice thereof is given as prescribed herein.

The Department of Municipal Services is hereby appointed to act as Transfer Agent with respect to the Series 2019 Bonds. If the Series 2019 Bonds are transferred to or held by any registered owner other than the initial purchaser thereof, the Commission by resolution may appoint a bank or trust company qualified under Michigan law to act as Transfer Agent and bond registrar for the Series 2019 Bonds, and the Commission may thereafter appoint a successor Transfer Agent upon sixty (60) days' notice to the registered owner of the Series 2019 Bonds.

The Series 2019 Bonds shall be signed by the manual or facsimile signature of the Mayor and countersigned by the manual or facsimile signature of the City Clerk. The Series 2019 Bonds shall have the corporate seal of the City impressed or printed thereon. If any of the Series 2019 Bonds shall be signed by the facsimile signature of both the Mayor and the City Clerk then such bond shall not be valid until authenticated by an authorized officer of the Transfer Agent. The Series 2019 Bonds shall be delivered to the Transfer Agent for authentication and be delivered by the Transfer Agent to the purchaser in accordance with instructions from the City upon payment of the purchase price therefor in accordance with the bond purchase agreement with the purchaser of the Series 2019 Bonds. Executed blank bonds for registration and issuance to transferees shall simultaneously, and from time to time thereafter as necessary, be delivered to the Transfer Agent for safekeeping.

The Series 2019 Bonds may be issued in book-entry-only form through The Depository Trust Company in New York, New York ("DTC"), and any official of the City is authorized to execute such custodial or other agreement with DTC as may be necessary to accomplish the issuance of the Series 2019 Bonds in book-entry-only form and to make such changes in the bond form within the parameters of this Ordinance as may be required to accomplish the foregoing. If the Series 2019 Bonds are held in book-entry form by DTC, payment of principal of and interest shall be made in the manner prescribed by DTC.

Any Series 2019 Bond may be transferred upon the books of the City maintained by the Transfer Agent by the person in whose name it is registered, in person or by his duly authorized attorney, upon surrender of the bond for cancellation, accompanied by delivery of a duly executed written instrument of transfer in a form approved by the Transfer Agent. Whenever any Series 2019 Bond or Bonds shall be surrendered for transfer, the Transfer Agent shall authenticate and deliver a new bond or bonds of the same series for like aggregate principal amount. The Transfer Agent shall require the payment by the bondholder requesting the transfer of any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to the transfer. The Transfer Agent shall not be required (i) to issue, register the transfer of, or exchange any bond during a period beginning at the opening of 15 business days before the day of the mailing of a notice of redemption of bonds selected for redemption prior to maturity and ending at the close of business on the day of that mailing, or (ii) to register the transfer of or exchange any bond so selected for redemption in whole or in part, except the unredeemed portion of bonds being redeemed in part. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the Series 2019 Bonds are held by DTC in book-entry form, the transfer of the Series 2019 Bonds shall be made in the manner prescribed by DTC.

Section 6. <u>Senior Lien Bond Form</u>. The Senior Lien Bonds, including the Series 2019 Bonds, shall be in substantially the following form with such revisions, additions and deletions as may be advisable or necessary to comply with the final terms established upon sale thereof.

Principal of this bond is payable at [Transfer Agent] [located in], Michigan, or such other transfer agent as the City may hereafter designate by notice mailed to the registered owner of record not less than sixty (60) days prior to an interest payment date (the "Transfer Agent"). Interest on this bond is payable to the registered owner of record as of the fifteenth (15th) day of the month preceding the interest payment date as shown on the registration books of the City kept by the Transfer Agent by check or draft mailed by the Transfer Agent to the registered owner of record at the registered address. The date of determination of registered owner for purposes of payment of interest may be changed by the City to conform to market practice in the future. For the prompt payment of the principal of and interest on this bond, the revenues of the Cable System of the City including all appurtenances, extensions and improvements thereto (the "Cable System"), after provision has been made for reasonable and necessary expenses of operation, maintenance and administration (the "Net Revenues"), and certain funds and accounts established by the Ordinance (defined below), are irrevocably pledged and a statutory lien thereon has been created. [This bond and the series of which it is one are of equal standing and priority of lien as to the Net Revenues of the Cable System with the City's outstanding [list other series]].

This bond is one of a series of bonds of even Date of Original Issue aggregating the principal sum of \$[principal amount], issued pursuant to Ordinance No. [ordinance number] (the "Ordinance") duly adopted by the City Council of the City, and under and in full compliance with the Constitution and statutes of the State of Michigan, including specifically Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended ("Act 94") for the purposes of acquiring and constructing improvements to the City's Cable System[, to fund the bond reserve account for the bonds,] [, to pay capitalized interest,] and to pay costs of issuance of the bonds.

For a complete statement of the revenues from which and the conditions under which this bond is payable, a statement of the conditions under which additional bonds of equal standing as to the Net Revenues may hereafter be issued, and the general covenants and provisions pursuant to which this bond is issued, reference is made to the Ordinance. The City has reserved the right to issue additional bonds of equal standing with the bonds of this issue on the conditions stated in the Ordinance. Copies of the Ordinance are on file at the office of the City Clerk and at the designated office of the Transfer Agent, and reference is made to the Ordinance and any and all supplements thereto and modifications and amendments thereof, if any, and to Act 94 for a more complete description of the pledges and covenants securing the bonds, the nature, extent and manner of enforcement of such pledges, the rights and remedies of the registered owners of the bonds with respect thereto and the terms and conditions upon which the bonds are issued and may be issued thereunder. To the extent and in the manner permitted by the terms of the Ordinance, the provisions of the Ordinance or any resolution or agreement amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto, may be modified or amended by the City, except in specified cases, only with the written consent of the registered owners of at least fifty-one percent (51%) of the principal amount of the bonds then outstanding.

Bonds maturing in the years [maturity dates of bonds which can't be prepaid] inclusive, shall not be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the City.

Bonds or portions thereof in multiples of \$5,000 maturing on or after [first maturity date of bonds which can be prepaid], will be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the City on any date occurring on or after [first date bonds can be prepaid], in such order as the City may determine and within any maturity by lot at par plus accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

[If Term Bonds are sold, provisions describing mandatory sinking fund redemption of Term Bonds]

In case less than the full amount of an outstanding bond is called for redemption the Transfer Agent, upon presentation of the bond called in part for redemption, shall register, authenticate and deliver to the registered owner a new bond of the same maturity and interest rate in the principal amount of the portion of the original bond not called for redemption.

Notice of redemption shall be given to each registered owner of bonds or portions thereof to be redeemed by mailing such notice not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date fixed for redemption to the registered owner at the address of the registered owner as shown on the registration books of the City. Bonds shall be called for redemption in multiples of \$5,000, and bonds of denominations of more than \$5,000 shall be treated as representing the number of bonds obtained by dividing the denomination of the bonds by \$5,000, and such bonds may be redeemed in part. The notice of redemption for bonds redeemed in part shall state that, upon surrender of the bond to be redeemed, a new bond or bonds in the same aggregate principal amount equal to the unredeemed portion of the bonds surrendered shall be issued to the registered owner thereof with the same interest rate and maturity. No further interest on bonds or portions of bonds called for redemption shall accrue after the date fixed for redemption, whether the bonds have been presented for redemption or not, provided funds are on hand with the Transfer Agent to redeem the bonds or portion thereof.

This bond is transferable only upon the books of the City kept for that purpose at the office of the Transfer Agent by the registered owner hereof in person, or by the registered owner's attorney duly authorized in writing, upon the surrender of this bond together with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the Transfer Agent duly authorized in writing and thereupon a new registered bond or bonds in the same aggregate principal amount and of the same maturity shall be issued to the transferee in exchange therefor as provided in the Ordinance, and upon the payment of the charges, if any, therein prescribed. The Transfer Agent shall not be required (i) to issue, register the transfer of, or exchange any bond during a period beginning at the opening of business 15 days before the day of the mailing of a notice of redemption of bonds selected for redemption under the Ordinance and ending at the close of business on the date of that mailing, or (ii) to register the transfer of or exchange any bond so selected for redemption in whole or in part, except the unredeemed portion of bonds being redeemed in part. This bond can only be transferred in the denomination of \$100,000 or any integral multiple of \$5,000 in excess of \$100,000.

THIS BOND IS A SELF-LIQUIDATING BOND AND IS NOT A GENERAL OBLIGATION OF THE CITY AND DOES NOT CONSTITUTE AN INDEBTEDNESS OF THE CITY WITHIN ANY CONSTITUTIONAL, STATUTORY OR CHARTER LIMITATION, AND IS PAYABLE BOTH AS TO PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST SOLELY FROM THE NET REVENUES OF THE CABLE SYSTEM AND CERTAIN FUNDS AND ACCOUNTS ESTABLISHED UNDER THE ORDINANCE. THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THIS BOND ARE SECURED BY THE STATUTORY LIEN HEREINBEFORE DESCRIBED.

The City has covenanted and agreed in the Ordinance to fix, establish, maintain and collect at all times while any bonds payable from Net Revenues shall be outstanding, such rates, fees, and charges for the sale of the output, capacity, use or service furnished by the Cable System, which, together with other income, shall be reasonably expected to yield Net Revenues equal to at least the sum of 110% of the amount necessary to provide for payment of the interest upon and the principal of all bonds payable from the Net Revenues of the Cable System as and when the same become due and payable, and in addition to maintain a bond and interest redemption account (including a bond reserve account) therefor, to provide for the payment of expenses of administration and operation and such expenses for

maintenance of the Cable System as are necessary to preserve the same in good repair and working order, and to provide for such other expenditures and funds for the Cable System as are required by the Ordinance.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required by law to be done precedent to and in the issuance of this bond and the series of bonds of which this is one have been done and performed in regular and due time and form as required by law.

This bond is not valid or obligatory for any purpose until the Transfer Agent's Certificate of Authentication on this bond has been executed by the Transfer Agent.

Payment of Bonds; Defeasance. The Bonds and the interest thereon shall be Section 7. payable solely from the Net Revenues (except to the extent payable from the proceeds of bond insurance or other credit enhancement or from the proceeds of Bonds), and to secure such payment, there is hereby created a statutory lien upon the whole of the Net Revenues which shall be a first lien. Pursuant to provisions of Act 94, the City hereby pledges to the repayment of principal of, interest on and redemption premiums, if any, on the Bonds, the funds and accounts established by this Ordinance other than the Rebate Account, and a statutory lien is hereby created on such funds and accounts. The liens and pledge provided above shall continue until payment in full of the principal of and interest on all Bonds payable from Net Revenues, or, until Sufficient cash, Sufficient Government Obligations, Sufficient Municipal Obligations or any combination thereof shall have been deposited in trust for payment in full of the principal of and the interest on all Bonds to be paid or defeased to their maturity, or, if called or if irrevocable instructions have been given to call for redemption, to the date fixed for redemption together with the amount of the redemption premium, if any. Upon deposit Sufficient cash, Sufficient Government Obligations, Sufficient Municipal Obligations or any combination thereof, as provided in the previous sentence, the statutory lien herein created shall be terminated with respect to the Bonds to be defeased, the Registered Owners of these Bonds shall have no further rights under this Ordinance except for payment from the deposited funds and for rights of replacement, registration and transfer, and such Bonds shall no longer be considered to be Outstanding Bonds under this Ordinance.

Section 8. <u>Management</u>. The operation, repair and management of the System and the acquisition of the Project shall be under the supervision and control of the Commission subject to such rights and duties as are reserved by law to the Council.

Section 9. <u>Rates and Charges</u>. The rates to be charged for service furnished by the System and the methods of collection and enforcement of the collection of said rates shall be those permitted by law and established by the Commission and in effect in the City on the date of adoption of this Ordinance, which rates and methods of collection and enforcement are hereby approved by the Council.

Section 10. <u>No Free Service or Use</u>. No free service or use of the System, or service or use of the System at less than cost, shall be furnished by the System to any person, firm or corporation, public or private, or to any public agency or instrumentality, including the City.

Section 11. <u>Rate Covenant</u>. The rates now in effect are estimated to be sufficient to provide for the payment of the expenses of administration and operation and such expenses for maintenance of the System as are necessary to preserve the System in good repair and working order, to provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same become due and payable, and the maintenance of the reserve therefor and to provide for all other obligations, expenditures and funds for the System required by law and this Ordinance. In addition, it is agreed that the City will at all times fix,

establish, maintain and collect rates, fees and charges for the sale of the output, capacity, use or service of the System which, together with other income, are reasonably expected to yield Net Revenues equal to at least one hundred ten percent (110%) of the Aggregate Debt Service Requirement on the Senior Lien Bonds for the forthcoming twelve (12) month period plus such amount as is necessary to comply with all covenants in this Ordinance and to pay all charges and liens whatsoever payable out of Net Revenues in such period. In calculating Net Revenues under this Section 11 the City shall not include any investment earnings to be received from investment of the Bond Reserve Account.

Section 12. Operating Year. The System shall be operated on the basis of an operating year which is the same as the fiscal year of the City. For purposes of determining the annual Aggregate Debt Service Requirements for any operating year, payments of principal and interest due on the first day of the operating year shall be considered to be part of the Aggregate Debt Service Requirements for the preceding operating year.

Section 13. <u>Funds and Accounts; Flow of Funds</u>. All Revenues of the System shall be set aside as collected and credited to a fund to be designated CABLE SYSTEM RECEIVING FUND. The Revenues so credited are pledged for the purpose of the following funds and shall be transferred or debited from the Receiving Fund periodically in the manner and at the times hereinafter specified:

A. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE ACCOUNT:

Out of the Revenues credited to the Receiving Fund there shall be first set aside in, or credited to an account hereby ordered to be established, maintained and designated OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE ACCOUNT, a sum sufficient to provide for the payment of the expenses of administration and operation of the System including such current expenses for the maintenance of the System as may be necessary to preserve the same in good repair and working order.

The Commission, prior to the commencement of each operating year, shall adopt a budget covering the foregoing expenses for each year. During the course of the operating year, the total of such expenses shall not exceed the total amount specified in said budget, except by a vote of two thirds (2/3) of the members elect of the Commission. No payments shall be made to the City from monies credited to the Operation and Maintenance Account except for services directly rendered to the System by the City or its personnel.

B. BOND AND INTEREST REDEMPTION ACCOUNT:

There shall be established and maintained a separate depositary account designated BOND AND INTEREST REDEMPTION ACCOUNT, the moneys on deposit therein from time to time to be used solely, except for required deposits to the Rebate Account, for the purpose of paying the principal of, redemption premiums (if any) and interest on the Senior Lien Bonds.

Out of the Revenues remaining in the Receiving Fund, after provision for the credit or deposit to the Operation and Maintenance Account, there shall next be set aside, monthly, in the Redemption Account a sum proportionately sufficient to provide for the payment of the principal of, mandatory redemption requirements, if any, and interest on the Senior Lien Bonds as and when the same become due and payable, subject to any credit therefor as provided in this Section 13(B). If there shall be any deficiency in the amount previously required to be set aside, then the amount of such deficiency shall be added to the next succeeding month's requirements.

There is hereby established in the Redemption Account a separate account to be known as the BOND RESERVE ACCOUNT. From the proceeds of the sale of the Series 2019 Bonds or other moneys or investments available to the City there shall be deposited an amount in the Bond Reserve Account which shall cause the amount on deposit in the Bond Reserve Account to equal the Bond Reserve Requirement. The City may meet the Bond Reserve Requirement by cash, or by a letter of credit, surety bond or insurance policy if the provider or issuer thereof shall be rated by a nationally recognized bond rating agency as high or higher than the Senior Lien Bonds or as otherwise acceptable to the initial purchaser of any series of Bonds. Except as hereinafter provided, the moneys credited to the Bond Reserve Account shall be used solely for the payment of the principal of, redemption premiums (if any) and interest on the Senior Lien Bonds as to which there would otherwise be a default. If at any time it shall be necessary to use the moneys or the surety bond credited to the Bond Reserve Account for such payment, then the moneys so used shall be replaced or repaid over a period of not

more than five years or such other period as required by the letter of credit, surety bond, or insurance policy securing the Bonds Reserve Account, from the Net Revenues first received thereafter which are not required for current principal and interest requirements. If at any time there is any excess in the Bond Reserve Account over the Bond Reserve Requirement, such excess may be transferred to such fund or account as the City shall direct. If Additional Bonds (except Additional Bonds used for refunding) from time to time are issued, each ordinance authorizing such Additional Bonds may either (i) provide that the Additional Bonds are equally and ratably secured by the Bond Reserve Account funded according to the Bond Reserve Requirement, or (ii) provide for the creation of a separate bond reserve account securing that series of Additional Bonds and a different reserve requirement, or state that no bond reserve account is required.

No further payments need be made into the Redemption Account after enough of the Senior Lien Bonds have been retired so that the amount then held in the Redemption Account (including the Bond Reserve Account) is equal to the entire amount of principal and interest which will be payable at the time of maturity of all Outstanding Senior Lien Bonds and the monies so held shall be used solely to pay the principal of and interest on the Senior Lien Bonds including redemption premiums, if any, as the Senior Lien Bonds become due either by maturity or by redemption prior to maturity.

A redemption requirement for the Senior Lien Bonds may be satisfied by calling the Senior Lien Bonds as provided in this Ordinance or by the purchase and surrender to the Transfer Agent of Senior Lien Bonds of the same issue and maturity from moneys allocated therefor as provided herein, or purchased with other funds legally available therefor. The City shall elect the manner in which it intends to satisfy a redemption requirement not less than forty-five days prior to the date of redemption.

C. JUNIOR LIEN BOND AND INTEREST REDEMPTION ACCOUNT:

If the City shall ever issue Junior Lien Bonds, there shall be established and maintained a separate depositary account for the purpose of paying the principal, redemption premiums, if any, and interest on such Junior Lien Bonds as they come due. Revenues remaining in the Receiving Fund, after provision has been made for the requirements of the Operation and Maintenance Account and of the Redemption Account including the Bond Reserve Account, shall be set aside, but not more often than monthly, in an account for the Junior Lien Bonds in accordance with the ordinance authorizing the issuance of the Junior Lien Bonds. Additionally, a separate account may also be established within such account as a bond reserve account to be funded on a junior lien basis in accordance with the ordinance authorizing the issuance of the Junior Lien Bonds. The detail of the establishment and maintenance of such account shall be provided in the ordinance of the Council authorizing the issuance of such Junior Lien Bonds.

D. REPLACEMENT AND IMPROVEMENT ACCOUNT:

There next shall be established and maintained an account designated REPLACEMENT AND IMPROVEMENT ACCOUNT. Except as hereinafter provided, the money credited thereto shall be used solely for the purpose of making major repairs, replacements and improvements to the System. There shall next be set aside in or credited to the Replacement Account, after provision is made for the requirements of the foregoing funds and accounts, such additional funds as the City may deem advisable. If at any time it shall be necessary to use moneys in the Replacement Account the moneys so used shall be replaced from any moneys in the Receiving Fund which are not required by this Ordinance to be used for the Rebate Account, Operation and Maintenance Account, Redemption Account (including the Bond Reserve Account), or the Junior Lien Bond and Interest Redemption Account.

E. SURPLUS MONEYS:

Any Revenues in the Receiving Fund at the end of any quarter of any operating year after satisfying all requirements of the Operation and Maintenance Account, the Redemption Account (including the Bond Reserve Account), the Replacement Account, Rebate Account and the Junior Lien Bond and Interest Redemption Account shall be deemed to be surplus moneys, and may, at the option of the Commission be used for any of the following purposes:

- 1. Used to repay inter-fund loans.
- 2. Transferred to the General Fund of the City as a payment in lieu of taxes. The amount so transferred to the General Fund in any operating year shall not exceed the total of the

payments made by the City to the System for services furnished to the City for the prior operating year.

- 3. Transferred to the construction fund for the purpose of paying the costs of the Project.
- 4. After completion of the Project, transferred to the Replacement Account.
- 5. After completion of the Project, transferred to the Redemption Account and used for the redemption, payment, or purchase of Bonds.

If there should be any deficit in the Operation and Maintenance Account, Redemption Account (including the Bond Reserve Account), Junior Lien Bond and Interest Redemption Account, or the Replacement Account on account of defaults in setting aside therein the amounts required herein, then transfers shall be made from the moneys remaining in the Receiving Fund at the end of any operating year to those funds in the priority and order specified herein to the extent of any deficit before any other disposition is made of said monies in the Receiving Fund at the end of any operating year.

Section 14. Rebate Account. There shall be established and maintained an account designated the REBATE ACCOUNT. Moneys representing investment earnings or profits shall be transferred annually from all funds and accounts established under this Ordinance and deposited in the Rebate Account in an amount sufficient to enable the City to rebate investment earnings to the federal government, if necessary, in accordance with the requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Funds on deposit in the Rebate Account are not pledged as security for the Bonds. Monies shall be deposited in the Rebate Account and shall be rebated to the federal government unless the City has received an opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel that failure to take such actions will not adversely affect the exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes of the interest on such Bonds.

Section 15. <u>Segregation of Accounts; Funds on Hand</u>. Moneys in the several funds and accounts established pursuant to this Ordinance, except moneys in the Redemption Account (including the Bond Reserve Account), the Junior Lien Bond and Interest Redemption Account, and the Rebate Account, and moneys derived from the proceeds of sale of the Bonds, may be kept in one deposit account, in which event the moneys in said account shall be allocated on the books and records of the City or deposited to the funds and accounts herein established, in the manner and at the times provided in this Ordinance.

Section 16. <u>Priority of Funds</u>. In the event the moneys in the Receiving Fund are insufficient to provide for the current requirements of the Operation and Maintenance Account, the Redemption Account, or the Junior Lien Bond and Interest Redemption Account, any moneys or securities in other funds of the System, except the proceeds of sale of the Bonds, shall be credited or transferred, first, to the Operation and Maintenance Account, second, to the Redemption Account, to the extent of any deficit therein, and third, to the Junior Lien Bond and Interest Redemption Account.

Investments. Moneys in the funds and accounts established herein may be Section 17. invested by the Commission in Investment Obligations, provided, however, that moneys deemed to be proceeds of tax-exempt Bonds shall be invested in accordance with the requirements of Section 34 of this Ordinance. Investment of moneys in the Redemption Account being accumulated for payment on the next maturing principal or interest payment on the Bonds shall be limited to Government Obligations bearing maturity dates prior to the date of the next maturing principal or interest payment respectively on the Bonds. Investment of moneys in any other funds or account, including moneys derived from the proceeds of sale of the Bonds, shall be limited to obligations bearing maturity dates or subject to redemption, at the option of the holder thereof, not later than the time estimated by the City when the moneys from such investments will be required. In the event investments are made, any securities representing the same shall be kept on deposit with the bank or trust company having on deposit the fund or funds or account from which such purchase was made. Earnings or profits on any investment of funds in any fund or account established in this Ordinance shall be deposited in or credited to the Rebate Account to extent necessary as required by Section 14 of this Ordinance and any earnings or profits remaining in the Receiving Fund, Operation and Maintenance Account, Redemption Account, and, at any time after they are fully funded, the Bond Reserve Account and the Replacement Account, shall be deposited in or credited to the Receiving Fund provided, however, that any earning or profit on the Bond

Reserve Account received prior to the completion of the Project shall be deposited in the construction fund

The City shall value investments in the Bond Reserve Account at fair market value and marked to market at least once per year. The average duration of investments in the Bond Reserve Account may not have maturities extending beyond five years.

The City covenants and agrees that to the extent permitted by law, it shall take all actions within its control and that it shall not fail to take any action as may be necessary to maintain the exclusion of interest on Bonds issued as tax-exempt bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes, including but not limited to, actions relating to the rebate of arbitrage earnings and the expenditure and investment of Bond proceeds and moneys deemed to be Bond proceeds, all as more fully set forth in the Non-Arbitrage and Tax Compliance Certificate to be delivered by the City with the Bonds.

Section 18. <u>Applicable Law</u>. The Bonds shall be sold and the proceeds applied in accordance with the provisions of Act 94.

Section 19. <u>Proceeds of Series 2019 Bonds</u>. The Commission shall create funds for deposit of proceeds of sale of the Series 2019 Bonds, and shall use the proceeds of sale of the Series 2019 Bonds as provided in this section.

There shall be established and maintained a separate depositary fund designated as the CABLE SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS SERIES 2019 CONSTRUCTION FUND in a bank qualified to act as depository of the proceeds of sale of revenue bonds under the provisions of Section 15 of Act 94. If the Series 2019 Bonds are sold as both a tax-exempt series and a taxable series then separate accounts shall be established within the Series 2019 Construction Fund for proceeds of each series. Monies in the Series 2019 Construction Fund shall be applied solely in payment of the cost of the Series 2019 Project and any costs of engineering, legal, bond issuance and other expenses incident thereto and to the issuance of the Series 2019 Bonds. Any unexpended balance of the proceeds of sale of the Series 2019 Bonds remaining in the Series 2019 Construction Fund after completion of the Series 2019 Project may, in the discretion of the Commission, be used for meeting requirements, if any, of the Bond Reserve Account, or for further improvements, enlargements and extension to the System. Any balance remaining after such expenditure shall be paid into the Redemption Account.

From the proceeds of sale of the Series 2019 Bonds there first shall be immediately deposited in the Redemption Account an amount equal to the accrued interest, if any, received on delivery of the Series 2019 Bonds and capitalized interest in the amount determined by the General Manager, and the City may take credit for the amount so deposited against the amount required to be deposited in the Redemption Account for payment of the next maturing interest. All or a portion of any premium received upon delivery of the Series 2019 Bonds may be deposited in either the Redemption Account or the Series 2019 Construction Fund, as determined by the General Manager in consultation with bond counsel.

There shall next be deposited from the proceeds of sale of the Series 2019 Bonds to the Bond Reserve Account an amount, if any, designated by the General Manager at the time of sale as necessary to meet the requirements of this Ordinance.

The remaining proceeds of sale of the Series 2019 Bonds shall be deposited to the Series 2019 Construction Fund, and, at the discretion of the General Manager, to a costs of issuance fund to pay for costs of issuance of the Series 2019 Bonds.

Section 20. <u>Covenants</u>. The City covenants and agrees with the Registered Owners of the Bonds that so long as any of the Bonds remain as Outstanding Bonds and unpaid as to either principal or interest:

- (a) The City will maintain the System in good repair and working order and will operate the same efficiently and will faithfully and punctually perform all duties with reference to the System required by the Constitution and laws of the State of Michigan and this Ordinance.
- (b) The Commission will cause to be maintained and kept by the Department of Municipal Services proper books of record and account separate from all other records and accounts of the City in accordance with Act 2, Public Acts of Michigan, 1968, as amended. The Commission will cause an annual audit of the books of record and account of the System for the preceding operating year each year

by a recognized independent certified public accountant. The audit shall be completed and so made available in accordance with Act 2, Public Acts of Michigan 1968, as amended.

- (c) The City shall maintain and carry, for the benefit of the Registered Owners of the Bonds, insurance on all physical properties of the System and liability insurance, of the kinds and in the amounts normally carried by telecommunications and cable companies and municipalities engaged in the operation of telecommunications and cable systems. All moneys received for losses under any such insurance policies shall be applied solely to the replacement and restoration of the property damaged or destroyed, and to the extent not so used, shall be placed in the Redemption Account and used for the purpose of redeeming or purchasing Bonds.
- (d) The Commission will not sell, lease, mortgage or otherwise dispose of any part of the System, except for sales or exchanges of property or facilities (1) which are not useful in the operation of the System, or (2) for which the proceeds received are, or the fair market value of the subject property (as certified by the Consulting Engineers) is, less than one percent (1%) of the Revenues of the preceding fiscal year, or (3) as to which the Consulting Engineers certify that the ability of the Commission to comply with the rate covenant described in Section 11 of this Ordinance will not be impaired.
- (e) The City will not grant any franchise or other rights to any person, firm or corporation to operate a Cable system that will compete with the System unless required or authorized by law and the City will not operate a system that will compete with the System.

Any bonds issued by the City payable from the Net Revenues of the System shall be issued under this Ordinance.

- Section 21. <u>Additional Bonds</u>. The right is reserved, in accordance with the provisions of Act 94, to issue additional bonds payable from the Revenues of the System which shall be of equal standing and priority of lien on the Net Revenues of the System with the Senior Lien Bonds but only for the following purposes and under the following terms and conditions.
- (a) To complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor. Such Bonds shall not be authorized unless the Consulting Engineers shall execute a certificate evidencing the fact that additional funds are needed to complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor and stating the amount that will be required to complete the Project. If such certificate shall be so executed and filed with the City Clerk, it shall be the duty of the Council to provide for and issue Additional Bonds in the amount stated in said certificate to be necessary to complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications plus in accordance with the plans and specifications plus an amount necessary to pay the cost of issuing such Bonds or to provide for part or all of such amount from other sources legally available therefor.
- (b) For subsequent repairs, extensions, enlargements and improvements to the System or for the purpose of refunding a part of any Outstanding Bonds (unless such partial refunding is done in compliance with (c) below) and paying costs of issuing such Additional Bonds including deposits which may be required to be made to the Bond Reserve Account. Bonds for such purposes shall not be issued pursuant to this subparagraph (b) unless the average actual or augmented Net Revenues of the System for any consecutive twelve month period out of the 16 months preceding the adoption of the ordinance authorizing the issuance of such Bonds shall be equal to at least one hundred twenty-five percent (125%) of the maximum Aggregate Debt Service Requirement in any current or future fiscal year on the Outstanding Bonds and on the Additional Bonds then being issued in the opinion of or as certified by an Independent Certified Public Accountant. If the Additional Bonds are to be issued in whole or in part for the purpose of refunding Outstanding Bonds, the maximum Aggregate Debt Service shall be determined by deducting from the principal and interest requirements for each operating year the annual Aggregate Debt Service Requirements of any Bonds to be refunded from the proceeds of the Additional Bonds.

Net Revenues may be augmented as follows for the purposes of this subsection (b):

1) If the System rates, fees or charges shall be increased at or prior to the time of authorizing the Additional Bonds, the Net Revenues may be augmented by an amount which in the

opinion of the Consulting Engineers will reflect the effect of the increase had the System's billings during such time been at the increased rates.

- 2) The actual Net Revenues may be augmented by the estimated increase in Net Revenues which in the opinion of the Consulting Engineers will accrue (a) as a result of new customers who have been identified by an agreement to purchase service from the System who had not been serviced during the preceding 12 months or (b) as a result of any other new customer or expansion of service to any existing customers or (c) as a result of potential customers which exist in a new service area who will be serviced by the acquisition of the repairs, extensions, enlargements and improvements to said System which have been made during the preceding twelve months or which will be acquired in whole or in part from the proceeds of the Additional Bonds to be issued.
- 3) If the Bond Reserve Account is to be fully funded to an amount equal to the Bond Reserve Requirement funded from the proceeds of Additional Bonds then the actual Net Revenues may be augmented by an amount equal to the investment income representing interest on investments estimated to be received each operating year from the addition to the Bond Reserve Account to be funded from the proceeds of the Additional Bonds being issued.

No Additional Bonds of equal standing as to the Net Revenues of the System shall be issued pursuant to the authorization contained in subparagraphs (b) or (d) if the City shall then be in default in making its required payments to the Operating and Maintenance Account or the Redemption Account.

- (c) For refunding all of the Outstanding Bonds and paying costs of issuing such Additional Bonds including deposits which may be required to be made to the Bond Reserve Account. For refunding a part of the Outstanding Bonds and paying costs of issuing such Additional Bonds, if after giving effect to the refunding the maximum amount of Aggregate Debt Service in each future fiscal year shall be less than the Aggregate Debt Service in each future fiscal year prior to giving effect to the refunding.
- (d) Additional Bonds may be issued without meeting any of the conditions and tests set forth in subsection (b) above for any one or more of the following purposes:
 - (i) the cost of acquisition and construction of any repairs, replacements, betterments, improvements, major renewals or corrections of any damage or loss to the System necessary, in the opinion of the Consulting Engineers, to keep the System in good operating condition or to prevent a loss of Revenues therefrom to the extent that the cost thereof cannot reasonably be paid from the Replacement Account or from insurance proceeds, or
 - (ii) the cost of decommissioning, disposal or termination of any part of the System.

Determination by the Council as to existence of conditions permitting the issuance of Additional Bonds shall be conclusive, provided this shall not eliminate any requirement for any other approval required herein.

As long as any Outstanding Bonds are insured, or any policy costs thereon are owed to a Bond Insurer, the City shall get the prior written consent of the Bond Insurer before the issuance of Additional Bonds under subsections (a) and (d) of this Section 21, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

Notwithstanding the foregoing requirements of this Section 21, the City reserves the right to issue Junior Lien Bonds payable as provided herein.

- Section 22. <u>Events of Default</u>. Each of the following events, with respect to an issue of Bonds, is hereby declared an "Event of Default":
- (a) default in the payment of the principal of or interest, or redemption premium, if any, on any Bond after the same shall become due, whether at maturity or upon call for redemption; or
- (b) default by the City or the Commission in the performance or observance of any other of the covenants, agreements or conditions on its part in this Ordinance, or contained in the Bonds; provided, no such default shall constitute an Event of Default until written notice thereof shall have been given by the Registered Owners of not less than twenty percent (20%) in principal amount of the Outstanding Bonds to the City and the City shall have had sixty (60) days after receipt of such notice to correct such default or cause the same to be corrected and shall not have corrected such default or caused the same to

be corrected within such period; and provided, further, that if the default be such that it cannot be corrected within such period, it shall not constitute an Event of Default if action to correct the same is instituted within such period and diligently pursued until the default is corrected.

The City shall forward a copy of any such notice as described in this Section 22(b) to the Trustee and to any Bond Insurer which is insuring Bonds subject to an Event of Default.

The Transfer Agent shall notify the Trustee and any Bond Insurer which is insuring Bonds subject to an Event of Default if the Transfer Agent lacks sufficient funds for the payment of the principal of, or interest, or redemption premium, if any, on any Bond when the same shall become due whether at maturity or upon call for redemption.

If any of the Bonds subject to an Event of Default are insured, then (a) the Bond Insurer shall have the right to consent to pursuit of any available legal remedy before the Trustee or the Bondholder shall be permitted to take such action, and (b) the Bond Insurer shall have the same rights as the Trustee or any Bondholder to pursue any legal remedy in an Event of Default.

Section 23. Accounting and Examination of Records After Default. The Commission covenants that (i) if an Event of Default shall have happened and shall not have been remedied, the books of record and account of the Commission and all other records relating to the System shall at all times be subject to the inspection and use of the Trustee and of its agents and attorneys, and (ii) if an Event of Default shall have happened and shall not have been remedied, the Commission, upon demand of the Trustee, will account, as if it were the trustee of an express trust, for all Revenues and other moneys, securities and funds pledged or held under this Ordinance for such period as shall be stated in such demand.

Section 24. <u>Application of Revenues and Other Moneys After Default</u>. The Commission covenants that if an Event of Default shall happen and shall not have been remedied, the Commission, upon the demand of the Trustee, shall pay over or cause to be paid over to the Trustee (i) forthwith, all moneys, securities and funds then held by the Commission in any fund or account established under this Ordinance, and (ii) all Revenues as promptly as practicable after receipt thereof. During the continuance of an Event of Default, the Trustee shall apply all moneys, securities, funds and Revenues received by the Trustee pursuant to any right given or action taken under the provisions of this Section as follows and in the following order:

- (a) To the payment of the reasonable and proper charges, expenses and liabilities of the Trustee, and to the payment of the amounts required for operation and maintenance expenses and for the reasonable renewals, repairs and replacements of the System necessary in the judgment of the Trustee to prevent loss of Revenues. For this purpose the books of record and accounts of the Commission relating to the System shall at all times be subject to the inspection of the Trustee and its representatives and agents during the continuance of such Event of Default; and
- (b) To the payment of the interest and principal or redemption price then due on the Bonds, as follows:

First: To the payment to the persons entitled thereto of all installments of interest then due in the order of the maturity of such installments, together with accrued and unpaid interest on the Bonds theretofore called for redemption, and, if the amount available shall not be sufficient to pay in full any installment or installments maturing on the same date, then to the payment thereof ratably, according to the amounts due thereon, to the persons entitled thereto, without any discrimination or preference; and

Second: To the payment to the persons entitled thereto of the unpaid principal or redemption price of any Bonds which shall have become due, whether at maturity or by call for redemption, in the order of their due dates, and, if the amount available shall not be sufficient to pay in full all the Bonds due on any date, then to the payment thereof ratably, according to the amounts of principal or redemption price due on such date, to the persons entitled thereto, without any discrimination or preference.

If and whenever all overdue installments of interest on all Bonds, together with the reasonable and proper charges, expenses and liabilities of the Trustee, and all other sums payable by the City under this Ordinance, including the principal and redemption price of and accrued unpaid interest on all Bonds which shall then be payable by declaration or otherwise, shall either be paid by or for the account of the

City, or provisions satisfactory to the Trustee shall be made for such payment, and all defaults under this Ordinance or the Bonds shall be made good or secured to the satisfaction of the Trustee or provision deemed by the Trustee to be adequate shall be made therefor, the Trustee shall pay over to the City, all moneys, securities and funds then remaining unexpended in the hands of the Trustee (except moneys, securities and funds deposited or pledged, or required by the terms of this Ordinance to be deposited or pledged, with the Trustee), and thereupon the City and the Trustee shall be restored, respectively, to their former positions and rights under this Ordinance. No such payment over to the City by the Trustee nor such restoration of the City and the Trustee to their former positions and rights shall extend to or affect any subsequent default under this Ordinance or impair any right consequent thereon.

Section 25. Appointment of Receiver and Statutory Rights. In the event of a default in the punctual payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds when due, the Trustee shall have the right to apply in an appropriate proceeding for the appointment of a receiver of the System in accordance with the provisions of Act 94. Subject to the provisions of Section 27 of this Ordinance, the Registered Owners of Bonds representing in the aggregate not less than twenty percent (20%) of all Outstanding Bonds, may protect and enforce the statutory lien and pledge of the funds and accounts and Net Revenues created by Act 94, and enforce and compel the performance of all duties of the officials of the City, including the fixing of sufficient rates, the collection of Revenues, the proper segregation of Revenues, and the proper application of Revenues. In addition to the rights conferred to Registered Owners by this Ordinance, the Registered Owners shall have all the rights conferred by the Act 94; provided, however, that the Registered Owner of each Bond agrees to enforce such right subject to the provisions of Section 27. The statutory lien upon the Net Revenues, however, shall not be construed to compel the sale of the System or any part thereof.

Section 26. Proceedings Brought by Trustee. If an Event of Default shall happen and shall not have been remedied, then and in every such case, the Trustee, by its agents and attorneys, may proceed, and upon written request of the Registered Owners of not less than twenty percent (20%) in principal amount of the Outstanding Bonds shall proceed, to protect and enforce its rights and the rights of the Registered Owners of the Bonds under this Ordinance forthwith by a suit or suits in equity or at law, whether for the specific performance of any covenant herein contained, or in aid of the execution of any power herein granted, or for an accounting against the City as if the City were the trustee of an express trust, or in the enforcement of any other legal or equitable right as the Trustee, being advised by counsel, shall deem most effectual to enforce any of its rights or to perform any of its duties under this Ordinance.

All rights of action under this Ordinance may be enforced by the Trustee without the possession of any of the Bonds or the production thereof at the trial or other proceedings, and any such suit or proceedings instituted by the Trustee shall be brought in its name.

Subject to the provisions of Section 27, the Registered Owners of not less than twenty percent (20%) in principal amount of the Outstanding Bonds may direct the time, method and place of conducting any proceeding for any remedy available to the Trustee, or exercising any trust or power conferred upon the Trustee, provided that the Trustee shall have the right to decline to follow any such direction if the Trustee shall be advised by counsel that the action or proceeding so directed may not lawfully be taken, or if the Trustee in good faith shall determine that the action or proceeding so directed would involve the Trustee in personal liability or be unjustly prejudicial to the Registered Owners not parties to such direction.

Upon commencing a suit in equity or upon other commencement of judicial proceedings by the Trustee to enforce any right under this Ordinance, the Trustee shall be entitled to exercise any and all rights and powers conferred in this Ordinance and provided to be exercised by the Trustee upon the concurrence of any Event of Default.

Regardless of the happening of an Event of Default, the Trustee shall have power to, but unless requested in writing by the Registered Owners of not less than twenty percent (20%) in principal amount of the Outstanding Bonds, and furnished with reasonable security and indemnity, shall be under no obligation to, institute and maintain such suits and proceedings as it may be advised shall be necessary or expedient to prevent any impairment of the security under this Ordinance or any acts which may be

unlawful or in violation of this Ordinance, and such suits and proceedings as the Trustee may be advised shall be necessary or expedient to preserve or protect its interests and the interests of the Registered Owners.

Restriction on Registered Owner's Action. No Registered Owner of any Bond Section 27. shall have any right to institute any suit, action or proceeding at law or in equity for the enforcement of any provision of this Ordinance or the execution of any trust under this Ordinance or for any remedy under this Ordinance, unless such Registered Owner shall have previously given to the Trustee written notice of the happening of an Event of Default, as provided in this Ordinance, and the Registered Owners of at least twenty percent (20%) in principal amount of the Outstanding Bonds shall have filed a written request with the Trustee, and shall have offered it reasonable opportunity, either to exercise the powers granted in this Ordinance or by Act 94 or by the laws of the State of Michigan or to institute such action, suit or proceeding in its own name, and unless such Registered Owners shall have offered to the Trustee adequate security and indemnity against the costs, expenses and liabilities to be incurred therein or thereby, and the Trustee shall have refused to comply with such request for a period of 60 days after receipt by it of such notice, request and offer of indemnity, it being understood and intended that no one or more Registered Owners of Bonds shall have any right in any manner whatever by his or their action to affect, disturb or prejudice the liens or pledge created by this Ordinance, or to enforce any right under this Ordinance, except in the manner therein provided; and that all proceedings at law or in equity to enforce any provision of this Ordinance shall be instituted, had and maintained in the manner provided in this Ordinance and for equal benefit of all Registered Owners of the Outstanding Bonds; provided, however, nothing herein shall be construed as impairing any right granted to Registered Owners pursuant to the provisions of Act 94.

Section 28. <u>Remedies Not Exclusive</u>. No remedy by the terms of this Ordinance conferred upon or reserved to the Trustee or the Registered Owners is intended to be exclusive of any other remedy, but each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy given under this Ordinance or existing at law or in equity or by statute on or after the date of this Ordinance.

Section 29. <u>Effect of Waiver and Other Circumstances</u>. No delay or omission of the Trustee or any Registered Owner to exercise any right or power arising upon the happening or an Event of Default shall impair any right or power or shall be construed to be a waiver of any such Event of Default or be an acquiescence therein; and every power and remedy given by this Ordinance to the Trustee or to the Registered Owners may be exercised from time to time and as often as may be deemed expedient by the Trustee or by the Registered Owners.

The Registered Owners of not less than twenty percent (20%) in principal amount of the Bonds at the time outstanding, or their attorneys in fact duly authorized, may on behalf of the Registered Owners of all of the Bonds waive any past default under this Ordinance and its consequences, except a default in the payment of interest on or principal of or premium (if any) on any of the Bonds. No such waiver shall extend to any subsequent or other default or impair any right consequent thereon.

Section 30. <u>Notice to Trustee of Default</u>. The Trustee shall not be obliged to take notice or be deemed to have notice or knowledge of any Event of Default hereunder, unless specifically notified in writing of such Event of Default by the Transfer Agent or by the Registered Owners of not less than twenty percent (20%) in aggregate principal amount of the Outstanding Bonds in default.

Section 31. <u>Notice to Registered Owners of Default</u>. The Trustee shall promptly mail written notice of the occurrence of any Event of Default to each Registered Owner of Outstanding Bonds at the address appearing upon the books kept by the Transfer Agent for each series of Bonds.

Section 32. <u>Appointment of Trustee</u>; <u>Acceptance by Trustee of Trust and Duties</u>. If required by the Registered Owners of not less than twenty percent (20%) in aggregate principal amount of the Outstanding Bonds, the City shall appoint a bank or trust company to serve as Trustee pursuant to this Ordinance upon occurrence of an Event of Default. The Trustee shall be a national banking association or a bank or trust company organized under the laws of the United States of America or any state of the United States of America having a reported capital and surplus aggregating at least \$50,000,000, and

shall be willing and able to accept the office on reasonable and customary terms, and shall be authorized by law to perform all the duties imposed on it by this Ordinance.

The Trustee shall evidence its acceptance of the trusts and duties imposed upon it by this Ordinance upon the occurrence of an Event of Default by filing a written acceptance thereof with the City. The Trustee shall execute the trusts and duties imposed upon it by this Ordinance upon the occurrence of an Event of Default but only upon the terms and conditions set forth in and subject to the provisions of this Ordinance. The Trustee shall, prior to having knowledge of any Event of Default as defined in this Ordinance and after the curing of all such Events of Default which may have occurred, perform such duties and only such duties of the Trustee as are specifically set forth in this Ordinance. The Trustee shall, during the existence of any such Event of Default (which has not been cured) exercise such of the rights and powers vested in it by this Ordinance and use the same degree of care and skill in their exercise, as a prudent man would exercise or use under the circumstances in the conduct of his own affairs.

No such provision of this Ordinance shall be construed to relieve the Trustee from liability for its own negligent action, its own negligent failure to act, or its own willful misconduct, except that:

- (a) prior to any such Event of Default hereunder, and after the curing of any such Events of Default which may have occurred:
 - (1) the duties and obligations of the Trustee shall be determined solely by the express provisions of this Ordinance and the Trustee shall not be liable except for the performance of such duties and obligations as are specifically set forth in this Ordinance, and no implied covenants or obligations shall be read into this Ordinance against the Trustee, and
 - (2) in the absence of bad faith on its part the Trustee may conclusively rely, as to the accuracy of the statements and the correctness of the opinions expressed therein, upon any certificate or opinion furnished to it conforming to the requirements of this Ordinance; and (b) at all times, regardless of whether or not any such Event of Default shall exist:
 - (1) the Trustee shall not be liable for any error of judgment made in good faith by a responsible officer or officers of the Trustee unless it shall be proved that the Trustee was negligent in ascertaining the pertinent facts:
 - (2) the Trustee may consult with counsel (who may be counsel for any Registered Owner) and the written advice of such counsel or any opinion of counsel shall be full and complete authorization and protection in respect of any action taken, suffered or omitted by it hereunder in good faith and in reliance thereon; and
 - (3) the Trustee may execute any of the trusts or powers hereunder or perform any duties hereunder either directly or by or through agents or attorneys.

None of the provisions contained in this Ordinance shall require the Trustee to expend or risk its own funds or otherwise incur individual financial liability in the performance of any of its duties or in the exercise of any of its rights or powers.

The Trustee may at any time resign and be discharged of the duties and obligations created by this Ordinance, by giving at least sixty days written notice to the City and to any Bond Insurer insuring Outstanding Bonds, and a successor Trustee meeting the qualifications of this Ordinance shall be appointed by the City. Appointment of the successor Trustee shall be subject to approval of any Bond Insurer if required by such company.

Section 33. Amendments; Consent of Registered Owners.

- (a) The City, from time to time and at any time, subject to the conditions and restrictions contained in this Ordinance, may enact one or more supplemental or amendatory ordinances or resolutions or both which thereafter shall form a part hereof, for any one or more or all of the following purposes:
 - (i) To issue Additional Bonds or Junior Lien Bonds;
 - (ii) To add to the covenants and agreements of the City contained in this Ordinance, other covenants and agreements thereafter to be observed or to surrender, restrict or limit any right or power herein reserved to or conferred upon the City (including but not limited to the right to issue Additional Bonds);

(iii) To make such provisions for the purpose of curing any ambiguity, or of curing, correcting or supplementing any defective provisions contained in this Ordinance, or in regard to matters or questions arising under this Ordinance, as the City may deem necessary or desirable and not inconsistent with this Ordinance and which shall not have material, adverse effect on the interests of the Registered Owners of the Bonds;

- (iv) To increase the size or scope of the System; and
- (v) To make such modifications in the provisions hereof as may be deemed necessary by the City to accommodate the issuance of Additional Bonds or junior lien bonds which (a) are "Capital Appreciation Bonds" or "Zero Coupon Bonds" to the extent permitted by law or (b) are variable rate bonds, but only if such modifications, in the written opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel filed with the Council, do not result in materially diminishing the security hereby granted to the Registered Owners of any Outstanding Bonds.

Any amendment or supplemental ordinance or resolution authorized by the provisions of this Section 33(a) may be enacted by the City without the consent of or notice to the Registered Owners of any of the Outstanding Bonds, notwithstanding any of the provisions of Section 33(b) below.

(b) With the consent of the Registered Owners of not less than fifty-one percent (51%) in principal amount of the Bonds then outstanding and with the written consent of any Bond Insurer insuring Outstanding Bonds, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, the City may from time to time and at any time adopt an ordinance or ordinances supplemental hereto for the purpose of adding any provisions to or changing in any manner or eliminating any of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any supplemental ordinance, provided, however, that no such supplemental ordinance shall (i) extend the fixed maturity of any Bond, change a Mandatory Redemption Requirement for any series of Bonds or reduce the rate of interest thereon or extend the time of payment of interest, or reduce the amount of the principal thereof, or reduce or extend the time for payment of any premium payable on the redemption thereof, without the consent of the Registered Owner of each Bond so affected, or (ii) reduce the aforesaid percentage of Registered Owners of the Bonds required to approve any such supplemental ordinance, or (iii) deprive the Registered Owners of the Bonds (except as aforesaid) of the right to payment of the Bonds from the Net Revenues, without the consent of the Registered Owners of all the Outstanding Bonds or, (iv) cause any modification or reduction of the lien on or pledge of the Net Revenues or the funds or accounts established hereunder. After the Bond Insurer insuring any Outstanding Bonds has granted its consent to such amendments or supplements, copies of the amendment or supplement shall be sent to any rating agency insuring the Outstanding Bonds.

It shall not be necessary for the consent of the Registered Owners under this Section 33(b) to approve the particular form of any proposed supplemental ordinance, but it shall be sufficient if such consent shall approve the substance thereof.

Promptly after the enactment by the City of any supplemental ordinance pursuant to the provisions of this Section 33(b), the City shall cause the Transfer Agent to mail a notice by registered or certified mail to the Registered Owners of all Outstanding Bonds at their addresses shown on the bond register or at such other address as is furnished in writing by such Registered Owner to the Transfer Agent setting forth in general terms the substance of such supplemental ordinance.

Section 34. Non-Arbitrage Covenant. For any series of bonds issued under this Ordinance on a tax-exempt basis, the City covenants and agrees that as long as any of the tax-exempt bonds remain outstanding and unpaid as to either principal or interest, the City shall not invest, reinvest or accumulate any moneys deemed to be proceeds thereof pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code in such a manner as to cause the tax-exempt bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of the Internal Revenue Code. The City hereby covenants that, to the extent permitted by law, it will take all actions within its control and that it shall not fail to take any action as may be necessary to maintain the exemption of interest on any of the tax-exempt bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes, including but not limited to, actions relating to the rebate of arbitrage earnings, if applicable, and the expenditure and investment of bond proceeds and moneys deemed to be bond proceeds, all as more fully set forth in the Non-Arbitrage and Tax Compliance Certificate to be delivered by the City with the tax-exempt bonds.

Section 35. <u>Municipal Bond Insurance</u>. For any series of Bonds issued under this Ordinance, if the Municipal Advisor recommends that the City consider purchase of municipal bond insurance (including an insurance policy or surety bond to meet the Bond Reserve Requirement), or consider qualification for approval for municipal bond insurance, then the General Manager is hereby authorized and directed, on behalf of the City, to apply for municipal bond insurance, to negotiate with insurers regarding acquisition of municipal bond insurance, and, in consultation with the Municipal Advisor, to select an insurer and determine which Bonds, if any, shall be insured. The General Manager is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the Bond Insurer regarding notices to be provided to the Bond Insurer, filing of annual financial information to be provided to the Bond Insurer, consents or approvals to be obtained from the Bond Insurer, the dates of receipt by the Transfer Agent of bond payments, and other requirements which the City may be obliged to meet in order to obtain municipal bond insurance.

Section 35. <u>Negotiated Sale of Series 2019 Bonds</u>; <u>Placement Agent</u>. In reliance upon the advice of the Municipal Advisor, the City Council hereby determines to sell the Series 2019 Bonds at a negotiated sale instead of a competitive sale for the reasons that the City will reduce costs of issuance without a significant increase in interest expense if the City negotiates sale of the Series 2019 Bonds to a financial institution or other sophisticated purchaser of municipal debt.

Citigroup Global Markets Inc. is hereby selected as Placement Agent to assist the City in arranging the sale of the Series 2019 Bonds to a financial institution or other sophisticated investor.

The maximum interest rate of the Series 2019 Bonds shall not exceed 6.00%. The purchase price for the Series 2019 Bonds, exclusive of any original issue discount, shall not be less than 99.00% of the principal amount of the Series 2019 Bonds, plus accrued interest. The City will approve sale of the Bonds by Resolution of the Commission.

Section 38. <u>Transfer of Funds</u>. The General Manager is hereby authorized to transfer funds from the Cable Television Fund as appropriate to the funds and accounts established under this Ordinance.

Section 39. <u>Necessary Actions</u>. In the event that the General Manager is not available to undertake responsibilities delegated to the General Manager under this Ordinance, a person designated by the General Manager or the Commission is authorized to take such actions.

Section 40. Ordinance to Constitute Contract. In consideration of the purchase and acceptance of any and all of the Bonds authorized to be issued hereunder by those who shall hold the same from time to time, this Ordinance shall be deemed to be and shall constitute a contract between the City and the Registered Owners from time to time of the Bonds; and the lien and pledge made in this Ordinance and the covenants and agreements therein set forth to be performed on behalf of the City shall be for the equal benefit, protection and security of the Registered Owners of any and all of the Bonds, all of which, regardless of the time or times of their authentication and delivery or maturity, shall be of equal rank without preference, priority or distinction of any of the Bonds over any other thereof except as expressly provided in or permitted by this Ordinance.

Section 41. <u>Repeal</u>. All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed.

Section 42. <u>Severability and Paragraph Headings</u>. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance. The paragraph headings in this Ordinance are furnished for convenience of reference only and shall not be considered to be a part of this Ordinance.

Section 43. <u>Publication and Recordation</u>. This Ordinance shall be published in full in *The News-Herald*, a newspaper of general circulation in the City qualified under State law to publish legal notices, promptly after its adoption, and shall be recorded in the Ordinance Book of the City and such recording authenticated by the signatures of the Mayor and the Clerk.

Section 44. <u>Effective Date</u>. As provided in Act 94, this Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its adoption.

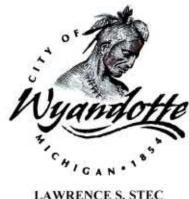

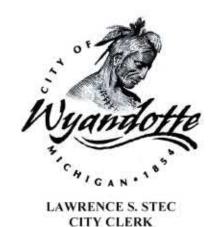

I am requesting the following budget amendments:

- Move \$5000 from 101-336-825-930 to 101-336-825-910 to cover projected expenses above current balance available through end of fiscal year. In comparison to expenses from this account in the same fiscal cycle last year this amendment is necessary to keep this account balanced through September.
- Move \$200 from 101-336-750-224 to 101-336-825-930 to cover new copier fees through end of fiscal year

Account 101-336-825-430 (Auto Maintenance) is at under 15% remaining. Barring any catastrophe I believe this will be enough to limp to the finish line. 101-336-750-222 (Medical/Rescue Supplies) is also under 15% remaining. I believe we have enough inventory at this point along with a couple of strategic purchases that may be necessary to carry us to the end of the fiscal cycle. I only mention these to let you know that I'm aware that they are significantly more depleted than they should be at this point in the year.

Account 101-336-850-540 currently sits at (\$3898.24). This was the account used to purchase the replacement thermal imaging camera for the unit that could not be repaired. When we had previously discussed this you had stated to go into the negative on this account with this purchase and that we would balance it at the end of the year. Given our proximity to the end of the fiscal year is this something I need to balance with this final budget amendment request or are we waiting until the actual end of the year and using remaining balances from other accounts to balance this one?

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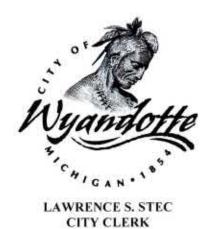

Form-Based Code

RRC CERTIFICATION

As a part of our involvement in the Michigan Economic Development's (MEDC) Redevelopment Ready (RRC) program and the fact that we've updated our Master Plan, we are required to update our current Zoning Ordinance. In accordance with the City's newly adopted Master Plan, it is advised that we explore a **Form-Based Code** with a **graphics-based format** for this update.

History

Wyandotte's Zoning Ordinance was originally drafted in November of **1949**. It was **35 pages** long and included a map.

Though the ordinance has not had a complete overhaul, the most recent updates were adopted in **2007**.

FORM-BASED CODE

Traditional zoning codes focus on **use** without much guidance on **building form**. The result yields buildings that are out-of-character with existing development and the preferences of the community.



What is Form-Based Code?

Form-based codes elevate the focus on **building form** and consider how it affects public spaces and the character of an area. This focus allows form-based codes to guide the creation of active, walkable neighborhoods.

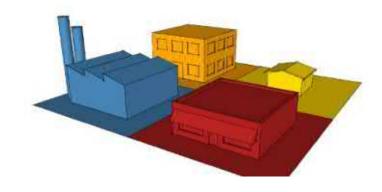
FORM-BASED ZONING ORDINANCE

Form-Based Code (FBC) is a way to regulate development that controls **building form** first and **building use** second.

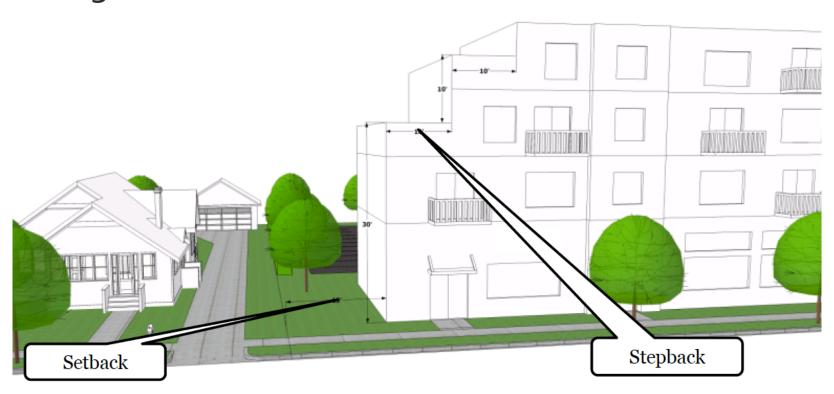




Unlike conventional zoning, the focus of a form-based code is on how buildings **relate to the streetscape**, not on what uses occur inside of them.

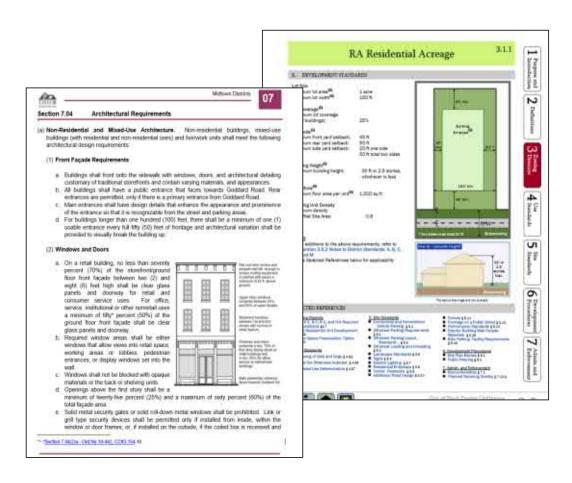

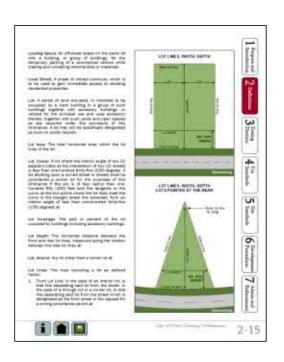

STATEMENT OF INTENT & PURPOSE

The City of Wyandotte intends to update its zoning ordinance and requests proposals from qualified land use planning consulting firms with the expertise in zoning for leading a process resulting in the preparation of a new zoning ordinance. The updated zoning ordinance shall be in compliance with federal laws, state statues, city ordinances and consistent with the adopted Master Plan. The updated zoning ordinance shall include form-based regulations as appropriate. The updated zoning ordinance will provide a clear and consistent set of procedures, actions and administrative guidance to implement the vision, guiding principles, goals and policies of the City's Master Plan. The new zoning ordinance should be delivered in an editable, consolidated, user-friendly format with tables and illustrative graphics that clearly communicate standards and regulations.

BACKGROUND

The City of Wyandotte has set itself apart in the region as a highly desirable waterfront community in which to live, work and visit. Our citizens have come to expect and rely on ethical, stable governance that is forward thinking and focused on building a community rich in culture and recreation, as well as commercial and industrial employment opportunities. Wyandotte's citizens, employers and visitors enjoy the benefits of city services provided through our city departments, offices, boards and commissions. In our efforts to be a 'Full-Service City', we are committed to excellence in: effective leadership, fiscal responsibility, public safety, providing a sound municipal infrastructure, economic development, and intelligent, planned and managed growth.

CONSULTANT SELECTION

The selected consultant is responsible for a comprehensive review of the zoning ordinance and will recommend revisions related to format, definitions, zoning trends, sign codes, parking requirements, etc. to be current with national standards and regional trends.

The consultant is required to review past text amendments, conditional use permits, re-zones and other related planning and zoning cases to make recommendations to updates in the zoning ordinance that may reduce common monthly Planning and Zoning Commission items. The consultant should be familiar with the 2015 Michigan Building Code to ensure that the new zoning ordinance does not conflict with the city's adopted Building Code.

The Consultant will review key background materials and will join city staff on a tour of the community. The Consultant will provide a summary of recommended changes to the zoning ordinance. Staff will provide the consultant with the following background documents for reference:

City of Wyandotte Zoning Ordinance

City of Wyandotte Master Plan

City of Wyandotte Future Land Use Map

City of Wyandotte Strategic Plan

City of Wyandotte Guide to Development & Doing Business

CURRENT ZONING ORDINANCE

Although it has been modified and amended since it was established in 1949, the city's current zoning ordinance has never been thoroughly updated. In addition, the ordinance is poorly organized. The city is looking for a complete overhaul of its current zoning ordinance. This new ordinance would repeal and replace the existing ordinance. The state of the current ordinance is as follows:

- It has not been comprehensively updated for many decades
- It contains standards that are outdated, difficult to administer, and are difficult to find;
- The language used in the ordinance is not as clear and precise as it should be;
- The ordinance does not reflect changes made in the recently adopted Master Plan;
- The ordinance has antiquated graphics and use tables;
- Some sections of the ordinance lack specificity or clarity, making zoning enforcement often difficult; and
- It is not user-friendly and lacks graphics to improve readability.

SCOPE OF WORK

Working together with city staff, the selected Consultant will conduct a public process and research to develop a new zoning ordinance for the city of Wyandotte. The city anticipates that the Consultant will work with staff, City Council, the Planning Commission, the Zoning Board of Appeals and the zoning ordinance update steering committee to develop either a form-based or a hybrid approach which incorporates a mix of form-based standards, performance based standards, incentives and conventional zoning standards as appropriate depending on the area of the city.

Project Goals

- Implement changes to the zoning ordinance which reflect the goals of the newly-adopted Master Plan
- Be consistent with State and Federal law
- Be intuitive, graphics-based and user-friendly
- Create a transparent, predictable and consistent process
- Promote high-quality design
- Respond to community concerns
- Promote infill and mixed-used development
- Add standards to improve non-motorized transportation connections
- Add innovative green infrastructure standards

Standardize and simplify development review

The city contains a variety of land uses, which will require differing and specific regulations. The Consultant will work with staff and the steering committee to identify these areas, determine the appropriate zoning approach to these areas (i.e., form-based, performance-based, incentive-based or conventional) and draft appropriate zoning regulations.

Public Outreach

The Consultant should incorporate a public outreach component designed to inform community stakeholders, the Planning Commission, Council, The Zoning Board of Appeals and the public on the new zoning ordinance. It should include a number of focused area workshops.

The Consultant should provide scenario-making and assessment tools to create, compare and communicate the benefits and drawbacks of alternative zoning choices; Consultant shall prepare periodic public updates for the city's website to keep the public apprised and facilitate responses.

For review and adoption of the new zoning ordinance, the Consultant should attend a minimum of two (2) Planning Commission meetings, and two (2) Council hearings. The Consultant shall be responsible for preparing all presentation materials for the workshops and meetings. The Consultant will provide the city with information and outreach materials to the city for posting on the city's website.

Integration of the New Ordinance into a User-Friendly Format

The Consultant shall work with city staff to ensure the new ordinance is easily accessible to the public, interactive and searchable. The city currently uses American Legal Publishing for zoning ordinance web platform.

Zoning Map Revisions

The Consultant will work with city staff to identify areas that will require map changes. Staff anticipates that zoning map changes may be required around specific node, overly areas, and in the DDA and TIFA Districts.

Zoning Use Guide

The Consultant will prepare simple 'How to Use This Ordinance' section in the front-end of the guide that explains how to use the new zoning ordinance. These pages should be easy to understand with graphics and examples which demonstrate how users can navigate the ordinance and find information in the ordinance.

Project Schedule

The Consultant will provide the city with an anticipated schedule for the work broken down by phase with a completion date no later than December of 2020.

Documents

The consultant shall prepare the following:

- Administrative Draft
- Public Review Draft
- Revised Public Review Draft
- Final Draft of the ordinance for presentation to City Council

The Public Review Drafts and Final Draft will be fully formatted and will contain a range of graphics, diagrams, tables and charts that complement and supplement the ordinance. The process of going from Administrative Draft to Public Review Draft will need to occur in close coordination with city staff and will require frequent meetings, conference calls or email communication. Once the Final Draft has been approved by the City Council, the Consultant shall provide a final version that includes any changes approved by Council.

Deliverables

The Consultant shall provide the complete zoning ordinance in both paper format (3 copies) and electronic format (Microsoft Word, PDF) for each draft period.

Once Council has approved the final draft, the Consultant shall update the zoning ordinance to include any Council-directed changes and then shall provide staff with paper copies (3 copies) and electronic format (Microsoft Word, PDF and the original files from any other programs used such as Adobe Illustrator, Adobe In-Design, Sketch-up, etc.)

PROPOSAL CONTENT

At minimum, the proposal should contain the information outlined herein. Additional information that the that the applicant deems relevant to the selection process may be included; however, concise and focused submittals are strongly encouraged. By submitting a proposal, and unless otherwise stated, it is understood that the Consultant has reviewed the relevant information and the Consultant has developed and informed understanding of the projected scope of work and has satisfied itself with the applicable conditions and requirements expressed in those documents.

Information Page

Include project name, name of firm submitting the proposal, contact information for the person(s) who will act at the project leader(s).

Project Team

Provide an organizational chart that identifies the individuals responsible for the key elements of the work scope and their relationship to those elements. Identify personnel assigned to the following duties: the principal-incharge; the project director and team leader, the daily project manager, the ordinance organizer and lead writer, land use and environmental expert, urban form and graphics, the public engagement expert and administration.

Qualifications & Experience

Provide up to three (3) examples of recent projects completed (or ongoing) by the proposed project team. Provide a brief description of the contract scope of work, contract amount, completion date and client reference name and contact information.

Methodology and Approach

Describe the proposed methodology and approach which will enable the City of Wyandotte to assess the proposer's capability to conduct this project in a structured and efficient fashion.

Scope of Work

Provide all details with specific task descriptions to demonstrate the proposer has considered all aspects of the study and that the proposer will cover them thoroughly. Representatives of the firm will be required to attend public meetings as necessary. The firm will also be required to provide any needed informational material deemed necessary to educate the community, Commissions and Council regarding the project.

Timetable

A timetable which identifies the milestones of the project, according to the Scope of Work, and projected completion dates throughout the project period.

FEE PROPOSAL

Firms are requested to provide a fee proposal that presents the estimated fee. The fee proposal should reflect the scope of work, term and compensation conditions cited above.

Sufficient information should be provided to justify the proposed fee and to serve as a basis for negotiating a contract. The feel proposal should identify personnel, estimated number of hours, and rate; type of equipment, hours and rate; and any outside costs for each identified work element.

Any contract resulting from solicitation will specify a maximum, not-to-exceed fee amount. Except in the unusual situation wherein the Consultant encounters circumstances that could not be reasonably anticipated, the city will not authorized payment beyond this amount. In consideration of this, any assumptions and/or the need for contingencies must be clearly spelled out in the Fee Proposal and used as a basis to compute a 'not-to-exceed' figure for this project. This figure should be sufficient to provide for any reasonably anticipated circumstances that may be encountered during project execution and completion.

SELECTION PROCESS

City staff and the zoning ordinance Commission Steering Committee will review the proposals submitted to evaluate the proposal based upon the following factors:

- 1. Past experience of the firm in preparing an updated zoning ordinance.
- 2. Record of the firm, and project manager and assigned team in completing these types of projects within the required timeframes and within the budget allowance.
- 3. Record of the firm and project manager in being responsive to the client's requests.
- 4. Community relations, including evidence of sensitivity to citizen concerns.
- 5. Ability to communicate effectively with citizens, elected officials and staff professionals.
- 6. Ability to conduct surveys and attendance at neighborhood meetings, Planning, Zoning Commission and City Council Meetings.
- 7. Ability to update the city of Wyandotte's zoning ordinance in an organized and timely manner.

The City of Wyandotte reserves the right to, without qualification, to:

NOTE: Section 1400- Principal Uses Permitted in B-2 Section A will permit churches as a principal use so needs to be deleted as a Special Use.

<u>Section 5.</u> Add to Article XVIII. IRO Industrial Research Office District, Section 1800, Principal Uses Permitted by adding Subsection I:

I. Churches, Mosques and Synagogues

Section 6. Reservation of Rights.

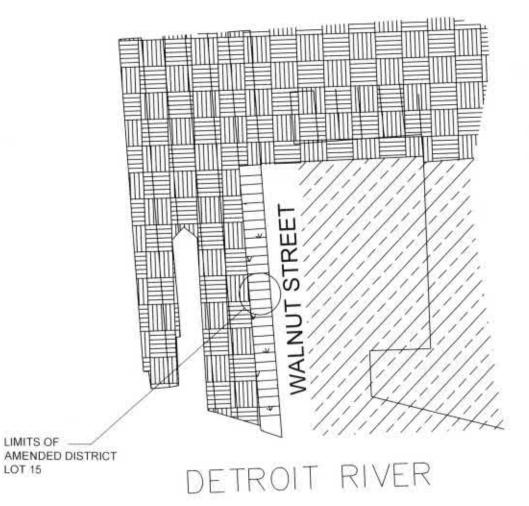

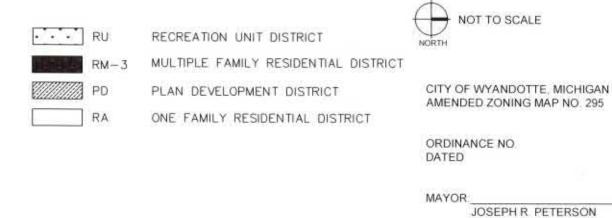

ITEM: Neighborhood Enterprise Zone (NEZ) – 166 Oak Street

PRESENTER: Joe Gruber, DDA Director

INDIVIDUALS IN ATTENDANCE:

BACKGROUND:

The City Administration has been working alongside A&J Realty Services, the Developers of the former Wyandotte Post Office located at 166 Oak Street. The Developer proposes to demolish northern portions of the former Post Office in Downtown Wyandotte and construct an additional 13,673 square feet of commercial retail space to add to the existing 15,078 square feet. As a second phase, four floors of residential space totaling 63,661 square feet will be built atop the first floor. The project is estimated to cost \$14 million and will result in approximately 33 new condominiums and 16 apartment units.

This property meets all of the eligibility criteria and qualifies for a Neighborhood Enterprise Zone (NEZ) tax abatement for Mixed-Use New Construction Project as it is located within the NEZ #8 neighborhood of the Downtown Area which was approved by the Mayor and Council on August 3, 2009. The legislation authorizing the NEZ program was created in 1992, and is known as the Neighborhood Enterprise Zone Act, Public Act 147 of 1992 (the "Act"), as amended. The purpose of the Act is to provide a tax incentive to encourage the development and rehabilitation of residential housing. Generally, the program works by reducing the taxes a property owner pays on a residential unit from 50%-100%.

STRATEGIC PLAN/GOALS:

BACKGROUND: One- and two-family dwellings are not permitted in RM-3 Zoned District, either as a permitted use or permitted as a special use. Many of the RM-3 Zoned Districts contain one- and two-family dwellings on lots of record. If they were to be destroyed, they could not be rebuilt. It is likely that the property would remain vacant as the lot would be to small for a multiple family dwelling. The amending of the RM-3 district to add the uses permitted in an RM-1 district would allow for the continued use of destroyed properties as one- or two-family dwellings as well as allowing all lots in the District to construct one- and two-family dwellings.

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF WYANDOTTE ZONING ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE IX. RM-3 MULTIPLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT

CITY OF WYANDOTTE, WAYNE COUNTY, MICHIGAN ORDAINS:

Section 1. Purpose and Intent

It is determined necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the City to adopt this article regulating the use of property in an RM-3 Zoning District.

- Section 2. Add to Article IX.-RM-3 Multiple-Family Residential District, Section 900 Principal Uses Permitted by adding new Subsections B and C:
- B. All principal uses permitted in the RM-1 Multiple-Family Residential District and subject to all regulations and requirements of the RM-1 District.
- C. Accessory buildings and uses customarily incidental to any of the above permitted uses, provided such building and uses are located on the same zoning lot with a permitted use.

Section 3. Reservation of Rights.

Nothing in this Ordinance or in the Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy or any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance.

Section 4. Severability.

Severability. Should any word, sentence, phrase or any portion of this Ordinance be held in a manner invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction or by any state agency having authority to do so for any reason whatsoever, such holdings shall be construed and limited to such word, sentence, phrase or any portion of the Ordinance held to be so invalid and shall not be construed as affecting the validity of any of the remaining words, sentences, phrases or portions of this Ordinance.

Section 5. Conflicting Ordinances.

Conflicting Ordinances. All prior existing ordinances adopted by the City of Wyandotte inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, hereby expressly repealed.

Section 6. Effective

This Ordinance shall be published along with the notice of adoption in a newspaper generally circulated in the City of Wyandotte within ten (10) days after adoption and shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its adoption or seven (7) days after publication whichever is later. The notice of adoption shall include the text of the amendment, the effective date of the Ordinance, and the place and time where a copy of the Ordinance may be purchased or inspected.

The Department of Public Service (DPS) desires to purchase an additional 112 carts from Cascade Engineering of Grand Rapids, Michigan, to meet this demand. Cascade Engineering has supplied the previous carts to the City. REPORTS & MINUTES

CITY OF WYANDOTTE BEAUTIFICATION COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES, APPROVED AUGUST 14, 2019

- 1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by John at 6:02 pm.
- 2. <u>Approval of Agenda:</u> Motion was made by Alice, seconded by Noel, to approve this meeting's agenda as presented. The motion was approved.
- 3. Reading and Approval of Previous Minutes:
 - a. <u>July 17, 2019 Regular Meeting</u>: After review of the minutes, Noel made a motion, seconded by Alice, to approve the draft minutes of the July 17, 2019 regular meeting of the Beautification Commission, without change. The motion was approved.
- 4. Chairperson's Report:
 - a. <u>Documents:</u> An updated Attendance Log was distributed.
- 5. <u>Treasurer's Report</u>:
 - a. <u>FY 2018-2019 Expense Report</u>: Approved expenses in the amount of \$155.27 for fertilizer and potting mix, and an accrued expense of \$650.00 for autumn hanging baskets were posted to the TIF Primary account, leaving a current balance of \$1836.46. There were no expenses posted to the GFM Reserve account, leaving a current balance of \$276.24.
- 6. <u>Public & Media Relations and Event Marketing Report:</u> Andrea has been fielding miscellaneous calls and messages.
- 7. "Adopt-A-Spot in Wyandotte" Program Update: Wendy reported that the Untied Family Church has declined participation with the log cabin site. In addition, John checked with Justin Lanagan regarding a "blessings box" installed at Bishop Park. Justin was not in favor of the blessings box due to multiple instances of vandalism in city parks. Wendy will contact the Historical Society and the Cultural and Historical Commission to gauge their interest in adopting the log cabin site.
- 8. <u>Community Garden Relocation Update:</u> Barbara reported that 32 community garden beds have been assigned. Bed 36 is unavailable due to a broken center post. DPS has been notified to repair. A number of gardeners have experienced tomato end rot on their tomato plants. This has been due to the large amount of rain that we have experienced, and is not due to plant disease. Gardeners have been advised to remove the affected fruits, and mulch their garden to maintain a consistent amount of moisture in the garden bed soil. A bulletin from MSUE on this issue has been emailed to all community gardeners.
- 9. Downtown Plantings Review:
 - a. Request To DDA and DPS Re. Fountain Area Plantings: Alice reported that Arctic Fire Red Twig Dogwood has been planted in the fountain area.
 - b. Wrap-Around Hanging Baskets Approval: Alice reviewed the new wrap-around planters that are proposed for the downtown area. They are proposed to be mounted on the decorative light poles, not the county light poles, about 8' above ground. The pilot installation is proposed to have 6 of the wrap-around baskets mounted on the blocks between Sycamore & Eureka, 3 baskets per side. The installation of this product was reviewed on site by Ryan Smith of WMS, who approved the installation. He did recommend that a rubber gasket be installed around the light pole, between the light pole and the basket frame, to prevent corrosion and paint chipping. The Commission has received a quotation from Eckert's Greenhouse in the amount of \$1715, including planting, shipping, and installation for the 6 baskets. Alice made a motion, seconded by Noel, to approve purchase of 6 wrap-around baskets. The motion was approved unanimously.
 - c. <u>Eureka Road Viaduct Planting</u>: John reported that the viaduct beds have been planted.

10. <u>Beautification Awards Selection</u>: All nominees for residential and business beautification awards were reviewed and scored. The criteria for judging were: Color, Texture, Creative Design, Hardscape Elements, and attention to Planting, Variety, and Seasonal Maintenance. Nominees were judged on a scale of 1-5; with 6 judges, the total points possible were 30. There were 20 winning residential nominees, and 6 winning business, school, church, and municipal nominees. 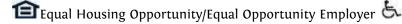

There shall be provided in all districts at the time of erection or enlargement of any main building or structure, automobile off-street parking with adequate access to all spaces. the number of off-street parking spaces and improvements shall be in accordance with this section, in conjunction with all land or building uses prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy, a Certificate of Compliance, Certificate of Approval or Certificate of Conformity as hereinafter prescribed. refer to Wyandotte Code of Ordinances for regulations for parking on city streets and in residential areas (Chapter 35, Article (iii)).

Section 2403.C:

Off-street parking spaces may be located within a side or rear yard. Off-street parking shall not be permitted within a required front yard unless otherwise provided for in this ordinance.

Front yard parking is not permitted according to the zoning of this address. Therefore the driveway extension must also extend 20' past the front of the house. The proposed driveway does not extend 20' past the front of the home.

Proposed front yard driveway will not hinder or discourage the appropriate development or use of adjacent land and buildings, will not impede flow of pedestrian or vehicular traffic, or impair the intent of the ordinance.

Ms. Zieger explained that there was a chainlink fence there, she thought she would build the new fence to the ordinance, she added that she did not change the post line or the post, then she received a letter from the City indicating the fence was in violation of the zoning ordinance. Ms. Zieger added that some of the neighbors even helped her build the fence, and her neighbor at 159 Mulberry is in full support of the fence and even helped built. Ms. Zieger added that she had brought in letter of support from her neighbors.

Chairperson Duran asked if the chainlink fence was still there. Ms. Zieger replied no, it was removed but the posts are the same, the fence was replaced with a wooden fence.

Member DiSanto and Ms. Zieger discussed where the fence was chamfered .

Member Flachsmann commented that he pulled in the neighbors driveway and backed out with no problem, there was an existing fence there, the new fence is very nice, and if she did follow the ordinance, the children's play area would be about 1/3 the size it is now.

Jennifer Warrow, 2324 - 2nd Street, present.

Ms. Warrow explained that she lives across the street and helped built the fence and she sees no issues with it. It is nicer than the chainlink fence, and added that it was her idea to build the fence. Ms. Warrow added that they changed the look of the fence, and did not move the posts.

Six (6) communications were received in favor of this appeal. Communication received from DTE.

Appeal #3305

Chairperson Duran read the appeal and asked that it be explained.

Angela Pizzo, owner, present.

Mrs. Pizzo explained that they have done many projects throughout the City and feels that the 5' setback is sufficient and they will provide a greenbelt. Mrs. Pizzo continued that to the north of the property are transforms with chainlink fence with barbed wire, and there are no homes facing the property. The business will be operated out of their office at 349 Antoine. Mrs. Pizzo also discussed the parking requirements.

Member Nevin asked the zoning of the property. Mrs. Pizzo replied industrial.

Member Flachsmann stated that the drawings explains everything, and he does not see anything wrong with the plans, but he does not live on Hudson.

Crystal Lewis, 293 Hudson, present.

Ms. Lewis stated that she looks out her kitchen window at the property, and she does see wildlife there, she doesn't want to see this in her neighborhood, it will make the property values go down, and she has been there for 23 years.

Rebecca, 250 Hudson, present.

Rebecca stated that she does not want this project, there are constantly big trucks Pizzo's property, and now they are parking in alley, semi's are constantly going down the street, there is a lot of traffic.

Rebecca continued that on McKinley and Antoine there is a vacant building for sale, and they should buy and use that.

Jason and Angela Bury, 333 Hudson, present.

Mrs. Bury stated that they objected to them buying property at end of street, building materials are stored there. Mrs. Bury added that Mr. Pizzo did offer to help neighbor build a fence. Mrs. Bury stated that there are constant semi's on the street, they don't have driveways, and where are the employees going to park. Mrs. Bury added that if they are going to build a building, then they can build a parking lot.

Pauline Kulcsar, 292 Hudson.

Ms. Kulcsar stated that a semi backed into her tree, there are a lot of semi's up and down the street, she has been there since 1983, and wanted to know why houses could not be built there.

Chairperson Duran explained that the area was zoned industrial. Ms. Kulcsar stated that it should be made back into a thriving neighborhood, make the area better. Chairperson Duran explained that she would have to petition to and make her case in front of the City Council.

Chairperson Duran commented that they need a 20' setback, and they are requesting a 12'10" setback, if they met the 20' setback, they wouldn't have to appeal. They are not in front of the Board appealing the use.

Ms. Kulcsar added that the Pizzo's trucks start up at 7 in the morning up and down the alley. Ms. Kulcsar added that the parking lot at 1410 McKinley has been cleaned up a little.

Susan Sekmistrz, 286 Hudson, present.

Ms. Sekmistrz stated that the has lived there for 46 years, she does not see McKinley, but hears the noise from the trucks and sees the trash in the alley, and she objects. She does not think that the area should be industrial, and does not want to see a warehouse.

Appeal #3306

Chairperson Duran read the appeal and asked that it be explained.

Martin and Bonnie Kolakowski, owners, present.

Mrs. Kolakowski explained that they have lived there for 35 years and parking has always been an issue. With the houses in the immediate area, there are 26 cars fighting for spots and tempers flare. Mrs. Kolakowski added that they do have a one car garage, but keep a classic car in there. They do want to build a new garage with a patio attached in front of it. Mrs. Kolakowski added that they do have a shed, and would like to keep it, if they build a new garage and a patio, they would only have a little bit of grass left. They do have a larger lot, and would be able to get 2 cars of the street. Parking is very bad in the neighborhood, and is an issue. Mrs. Kolakowski continued that during a snow emergency it is a challenge, they do use the emergency lot, and have been plowed in. Mrs. Kolakowski added that they do not want to leave Wyandotte. Mrs. Kolakowski added that they are going away for 6 weeks, and don't know what they will do with their car.

Mr. Kolakowski added that the driveways on 23rd Street are very narrow. He continued that he will not leave the house at certain times because he knows that he will not have a spot to park, and if he extends the driveway 20' and builds a new garage with a patio, he will only have about 5' of grass. Mr. Kolakowski added that the is an AirB&B on 23rd Street, and that does make parking worse.

Mrs. Kolakowski added that if they do build a garage, they would want to enter from the alley.

Member Flachsmann confirmed that the existing garage is off the alley, and if they build a new one, they would also enter off the alley. Mrs. Kolakowski replied that was correct. They now have 1 parking spot in the garage, and the driveway would give them 2 more spaces. Member Flachsmann commented that if you did have an attached garage, you could park in the driveway. Or if the drive was extended past the house, and gates were installed, you could park there if you needed it. Member Flachsmann asked if the hardship was inadequate parking on the street. Mr. Kolakowski replied yes.

Member Gillon asked if they would be keeping the bushes on the south side. Mr. Kolakowski replied that they would like to keep them.

Elaine Pero, 2434 - 23rd Street.

Ms. Pero stated that neighbors still yell at her if she parks in their spot, she tries to park in her garage, but being on a commercial alley, trucks block the entrance to her garage.

Mr. Kolakowski stated that he is trying to do neighbors a favor by taking cars off the street.

John Kruso, 2470 – 23rd Street, present.

Mr. Kruso stated that the homes in that area were built in the 1940's, no one had 2 cars at that time, soon he will be having 5 cars in front of his house.

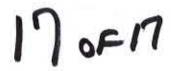
