Pedestrians will be allowed to purchase alcoholic beverages from adjacent, licensed establishments and shop, sit outside, or walk around, as long as they remain within the commons area boundary. Only bars and restaurants with social district permits can serve social district beverages in specially approved social district cups. Wyandotte's Social District will run daily from 11:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

SUCCESS Virtual Learning

Downriver's alternative high school option

OCCESS Virtual Learning-Downriver Center, located at 24680 Eureka Road in Taylor, is an alternative high school blending brick and mortar with virtual schooling. The Downriver Center is one of the 11 centers in the state contributing to the academic achievement of over 2,000 students across Michigan.

"We want to help Downriver families learn and know that there are other options besides their school district's virtual program," said Center Director Lynne Nowicki.

The Downriver Center is closing out its fifth school year with the goal of providing an accredited high school diploma to each student who enters the program. Students can enroll from age 14 until they turn 22. The Center can accept students who have been expelled from their schools along with those who choose not to attend.


"Kids need to know that when they come to our school, it doesn't matter what drove them to our door, it just matters what decisions they make every day going forward," Nowicki said.

The Downriver Center opened in the fall of 2018 and graduated their first class in 2019. According to Nowicki, COVID created a boom for the program and showed a lot of families the benefits of online schooling for their kids,

especially those who might have struggled in the classroom but thrived with remote learning.

SUCCESS Virtual Learning requires the Michigan Merit Curriculum. Students need 18 credits to graduate and there are no elective requirements, so kids can enter the school on track to graduate in three years instead of four. With the Center's self-paced education program, they have a history of graduating students early.

The school also provides students with an individualized graduation plan that assesses each student's credits, allowing the program to determine exactly what they need to complete each day to graduate on the day they choose.



"When you go into a traditional school and you're sitting in the classroom, you can sit in the back of the classroom and do nothing, pass the final and ultimately pass the class," Nowicki said. "In our program that's not possible, so students are getting more content practice in our program than maybe perceived in an online system."

Despite being a virtual school, Nowicki explained that the personal touch is a really important piece of

the program. Students and parents receive regular communication and support as well as in-person engagement activities. The Center is also a physical building that is open to the students to drop in, see real people, study and get help

with schoolwork onsite whenever they

In addition to having relationship managers and certified teachers who work with the students daily, SUCCESS Virtual Learning also provides career and college counselors who aid students with higher education applications, FAFSA and even sees students all the way through their trade school or four-year degree program.

"Those who work at the Center have passion, purpose and intention behind their jobs," Nowicki said. "It's always been about the kids and it always will be,"

Teaching Financial Freedom

Credit union program opens youths' eyes on the cost of being an adult

DVANTAGE One Credit Union is spreading financial literacy throughout the community one person at a time.

The credit union, with Brownstown and Southgate branches, recently held a Financial Reality Fair at Taylor High School, with more than 200



students learning the dos and don'ts of spending, saving and budgeting. It was a welcome mat of sorts to money management.

"It helps students learn what it's like to be an adult," said Lindsay Dennis, Advantage One marketing coordinator.

They learned about interest rates and how that can affect how much you pay for monthly mortgage costs. Different mortgage rates can have a big impact on someone's future financial stability, Dennis said.

"It's Money 101 and we're trying to help people not end up in a bad situation because they made a bad choice," she added. "The kids love it. They walk away saying, 'Wow. I didn't realize what my parents went through with buying groceries and other costs to run a household. They didn't realize it costs that much to be an adult. It opened their eyes and it's life changing."

Real life

Students at the fair were given fictional careers, credit scores and salaries. They had to make choices as they visited a dozen booths, where they were asked questions about potential monthly expenses like transportation, housing, insurance, entertainment and life events.

They had to make decisions about things like whether they should buy a fancy car, a bicycle or something in between based on how much money they had. The goal was to learn how to live within their means. Advantage One sponsored the event and representatives from other credit unions participated.

Free financial education programs are provided in person and virtually to

schools and nonprofit agencies that have embraced the program for their clients as well. Agencies are happy to provide another benefit at no charge to the organization or the people they serve, Dennis said.

Reaching out

Some of the advocacy agencies that are using the program include Vista Maria, helping girls and their families overcome traumas: Fish & Loaves Food Pantry, and the Information Center, a nonprofit that guides people through available services and resources.

"The program is for anyone who is in need of financial education," Dennis said, adding that if someone is struggling with mental health issues, getting their money concerns in order is one less thing for them to stress



Emily Thurston, Advantage One marketing director, said the organization works hard to build communities through outreach programs like the literacy education program teaching the cornerstones of budgeting and financial stability.

"We continue to improve financial literacy in young people and adults alike," she said. "They learn how to handle their money, how to spend it, how to save it and where to save it."

Advantage One is a financial organization with over \$240 million in assets, two branches and over 17,000 members located in southeast Michigan. 



Smuggler's adds national acts to entertainment roster

MUGGLER'S RUN on the River and Tiki Bar started bringing live national acts to its Wyandotte riverfront venue last year and the response from patrons has been over the top, according to owner Kevin Travers.

"It's Metro Detroit's newest and most unique concert and live entertainment venue," he said. "It's a true destination for live entertainment."

Last year Smuggler's revamped the stage, lights and sound system to better accommodate the large space - 20,000 square feet inside and a 20,000-square-foot patio. The sound system provides a whole new listening experience.

"The patrons and the bands are pleased with the actual sound they hear - it doesn't have to be too loud," he said. "It's given us a lot of great opportunities to book some really cool shows, where people can meet and greet these bands and see them perform up close and personal."

Travers has been attracting national music and comedy acts ever since.

"We take good care of the bands when they come into town," Travers said. "We're trying to build something that has a good reputation.

Agents talk to each other. They're super impressed with the venue."

This summer some of the national acts include Texas Hippie Coalition, July 23; Puddle of Mudd, August 4; and Dokken and Lynch Mob, August 5.

"It's surreal that our venue has secured acts like that," Travers said.

He tries to book local, regional, national and possibly in the future international groups performing a lot of genres - just about everything.

"They might be older acts, up-and-coming acts or underground acts who have a tremendous

following," he said. "It's fun trying to get these acts to Wyandotte, so everyone from patrons to the staff and the city are proud of what we try to do."

"We're still going to always have our local bands we've partnered with," he added. "We're a nightclub too, with a DJ and a wide variety of entertainment."

Smuggler's Run has long been known as a premier restaurant with an oversized tiki bar and live entertainment.

Travers decided to add the national and international acts to beef-up interest in Smugglers during the slower season between October and April.

"I needed to find a way so we can be open longer with shows," he said. "I need to keep my staff employed and making money so they can support their families. We thrived during COVID because we had live entertainment on the patio. We followed all the rules and people wanted to get outside, because they were tired of being cooped up. From 2018 to 2023 we learned more about what this facility was capable of doing."

Travers is working on booking a comedy show with nationally known comedians in November. He's also planning magic and children shows as well as symphony performances.

"We're trying everything we can to offer something for everyone in the community," Travers said. "Our clientele is a good mix and match of ages."



A GREAT GOAL

Youth soccer is available to all in Downriver and beyond By Nicole M. Robertson

OST of the world plays football with a round ball and well, feet, while American football involves throwing a ball that isn't even round.

It's true most Americans prefer our football but don't discount the world's game. The 2022 FIFA World Cup finals (what Americans call soccer) drew an estimated 1.5 billion viewers worldwide, while Super Bowl LVI was watched by fewer than 200 million, according to Sports Illustrated. CBS News is so confident of the game's popularity, it's planning to launch Golazo Network, a 24/7 streaming soccer channel, in April.

Detroit City Football Club (DCFC) makes it easy for kids to participate in the world's most popular sport, played by more than 4 million Americans.

"We have programs for players ages 2-18, from recreational programs all the way to competitive-level soccer," said DCFC Downriver Club Director and Staff Coach Jon Evans. "We want to provide soccer opportunities for everybody, no matter what their circumstances might be."

Evans, 34, a 2007 graduate of Woodhaven High School, earned his Bachelor of Science in integrative





studies with a minor in exercise science at Oakland University. He's in his eighth year coaching at DCFC.

"I'm a first-generation soccer player," he said. "It just stuck, because my brother did it, and I fell into

Evans noted many of his young players' parents were involved in American football when they were young.

Detroit City FC Downriver offers different programs designed for boys and girls looking for recreational playtime, or who want to build skills for competition.

Soccer Tots teaches fundamentals to children ages 2-5, focused on balance, coordination, socialization and emotional development. The Foundations Program (ages 5-8) develops the skills of the youngest players, preparing them for travel competitions, with a typical player-to-coach ratio of 1:8.

Developmental teams, unique to the Downriver area, bridge the gap from foundations to competitive travel. Competitive teams play in leagues throughout Metro Detroit and the state of Michigan.

"We want to help kids reach their goals in soccer," Evans said. "Currently, we are coaching kids who will play college soccer in the fall."

Tryouts for competitive teams will be June 10th and 11th at Heritage Park in Taylor.

"Our coaching staff is a little bit younger," Evans said. "We give our players an opportunity to continue with the game through coaching, offering job opportunities after high school. We give back, and it's something that our families can support and grow with."

The club becomes a family. Parents say, "When someone scores, we all score. When someone is hurt, we all hurt." That camaraderie is most important to Evans.

"We instill some of those values that they use on the field that as people they can become in the future," he said.

The nonprofit club keeps costs low for maximum participation, with scholarships available, Evans said.

"We charge at least 50 percent less than other clubs in the U.S.," he said. "Some charge \$4,000 a year, and our rec-based programs are right around \$60. If you break it down to the number of contacts/the games they get to play, it's less than \$10 per contact. So I think we're doing something right."

There's no long waits in security lines. Airlines often recommended you arrive at the airport at least two hours before your flight is scheduled to take off. On the other hand, since you're sidestepping security checks you can arrive at the train depot minutes before your train leaves.

When it comes to sticker shock the price of a plane ticket can be a game changer. The travel search website Hipmunk, which displays train options alongside flight results, found that on the top 100 Amtrak routes booked from 2018 to 2019, train travel was cheaper 80 percent of the time. Travelers choosing the train option saved an average of \$132.


Costs are cut by traveling on trains, too, because you can generally take more with you before paying extra baggage fees.

Fewer delays, more legroom

When is the last time you heard about a weather delay for trains? Flights, on the other hand, are postponed on the regular for ice, wind, snow and rain.

Trains are the way to go for those of us who get a growing sense of dread, feeling like we're trapped as we enter the narrow, enclosed tube. There's a sense of freedom on trains.

Trains offer more legroom and you can walk the length of the train and maybe stop at the dining or snack car for a change of



While you're in the dining cart grab something to eat - whenever you want - and choose from a menu. If children are in the travel group, trains offer them more chances to move around, too.

Another option

Air travel is sometimes limited for people with health issues, like stroke, respiratory disease or women who are in the last stages of their pregnancies.

Train travel has been found to have less of an impact on the environment, too. Some estimates say rail travel can reduce carbon emissions by 37 to 54 percent. In fact, air travel is listed as one of the fastest-growing contributors to climate change. Take a train and shrink your carbon footprint.

Let's face it, train travel is a simpler way to travel. It's rustic, romantic and harkens back to our ancestors, who often traveled by train from New York to various places around the country when they arrived as immigrants. There's a pull that reminds us of countless movies and books that use train stations as the backdrop for couples in love saying goodbye, greeting relatives and starting new life journeys.

What types of conditions require an ER visit?

Our two Downriver ERs offer 24/7 emergency care


"At Henry Ford Wyandotte Hospital and Henry Ford Medical Center - Brownstown, we provide easy access and an experienced ER team," says Elizabeth Plemmons M.D., FACEP, Chair and Medical Director of Henry Ford Wyandotte Hospital's Department of Emergency Medicine. "We offer a full range of services for major to minor emergencies, closer to home."

Conditions treated in the ER

"People may not realize the variety of conditions we see in our emergency rooms," Dr. Plemmons says. "Also, depending on the symptoms and severity, we may provide immediate treatment or use radiology tests such as X-rays and CT scans, lab testing or other tools to first make a diagnosis before determining the best next steps for care."

Some of the conditions that the Downriver FR team sees include:

- Chest pain: This symptom should never be ignored, because it could be the sign of a heart attack or a related condition such as heart failure. If you suspect heart attack, call 911 immediately.
- Stroke: Stroke is the leading cause of adult disability in the United States, and when you or a loved one is having a stroke, every second counts. If you suspect stroke, call 911 immediately.
- Abdominal pain: While many people experience a stomach ache occasionally,



- Headache: If your headache is sudden or severe with no known cause, or if you experience symptoms such as a high fever or prolonged vomiting, seek emergency care.
- Flu, COVID-19 and other upper respiratory infections: If you have a high fever, trouble breathing, chest pain, persistent vomiting, or are suddenly dizzy or confused, seek emergency care. These illnesses can also lead to life-threatening respiratory conditions such as pneumonia, and treatments are available.
- Cuts: Bad cuts can happen even with normal daily activities. For example, the phenomenon known as "avocado hand," which happens when someone tries to use a knife to cut out or stab an avocado pit and ends up cutting their hand instead. When a cut doesn't stop bleeding after applying pressure for 10-15 minutes, it requires emergency care.
- Dental emergencies: Severe toothaches cannot always wait until the dentist is open, and they may be a sign of abscesses and other conditions caused by serious, and potentially lifethreatening, infections.
- Diabetic emergencies: If you have diabetes and your blood sugar levels spike and can't be controlled, this could lead to a coma, kidney failure, nerve damage or blindness without treatment.

"These are just some of the common conditions we see," Dr. Plemmons says. "We treat a variety of conditions in patients of all ages - everything from sore throats and back pain to shortness of breath."



cardiology, orthopaedics, neurology and other areas - and can refer you to these physicians for additional care, when necessary.



The Wyandotte Municipal Services (Wyandotte Connex) telecommunications utility was created by local residents in 1981 when voters demonstrated their confidence in the department's ability by approving an ordinance to place the implementation, construction and operation of the new cable television system under the auspices of the Municipal Service department.

In 1983 the department installed the cable infrastructure throughout the city and began offering basic cable television services. Since than we have developed the limited basic cable television system into a full broadband telecommunications system.

In 2021 we began construction on Wyandotte's new Fiber to the Home system. Bringing state of the art fiber technology to your home or business.

In 2022 we also launched Wyandotte's own streaming service, DotteTV. Watch local content as well as the channels you love all on our streaming platform.

Improve Your Self-Esteem for Lasting Happiness

ELF-ESTEEM is one of the most frequently used and oldest themes in contemporary psychology. Therapists often talk about the need to raise one's self-esteem.

- You have a frequent need to prove yourself and may engage in activities you would otherwise not do to prove to others your importance.
- Fear of making a mistake or failure stops you from doing things you really want to do.
- You accept when others hurt you because you feel you don't deserve better.
- Fears that you are not worthy of or that others will hurt you stops you from starting new relationships.

The thing about self-esteem is that if you have too much of it, you irritate the people around you, but you feel okay. If you have too little, you suffer. No one needs to suffer. With some guidance, through a book, a therapist or a mentor, everyone can improve their self-esteem.

PUBLIC NOTICE Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS)

The Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) initiated a statewide effort to test drinking water from all schools that use well water and community water supplies. The test examines for a group of manmade chemicals called per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). EGLE is taking this precautionary step of testing these drinking water sources to determine if public health actions are needed. It is not uncommon to find low levels of PFAS in drinking water supplies, as PFAS can be found in firefighting foams, stain repellants, nonstick cookware, waterproof clothing, food wrappers and many other household products. PFAS do not break down in the environment and move easily into water. The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) set a Lifetime Health Advisory (LHA) level for two PFAS in drinking water, perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA) and perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS). The LHA level is 70 parts per trillion (ppt, equal to 70 ng/L) for PFOA and PFOS combined, or individually if only one is present. The EPA has not set health advisory levels for other PFAS compounds. The State of Michigan is using 70 ppt for decision-making purposes. The Wyandotte Municipal Services Water Department's water system was tested by AECOM, EGLE's contractor on 7/26/2018. The test results can be found on the Michigan PFAS Action Response Team website, www.michigan.gov/ pfasresponse. The results show that of the PFOA and PFOS tested, none were detected in Wyandotte's treated drinking water. The tested level is well below the EPA's lifetime health

Rusty Water

Rust comes from the inside of the piping system that delivers water to your house. Normally, water flows to your house undisturbed. Sometimes, main breaks, or hydrants that are opened for a fire or to flow a hydrant for a system problem can cause the flow to increase or to reverse and possibly disturb the rust in the pipes.

NORMALLY RUSTY WATER EVENTS DISSIPATE IN 4-6 HOURS BUT COULD LAST LONGER DEPENDING ON AREA WATER USAGE. The easiest way to quickly get rid of the rust is to run cold water in your bathtub or flush your toilet until the water runs clear.

DO NOT USE HOT WATER.

Rusty water can get into your water heater and it can take longer to get the rust to clear out of your plumbing.

DO NOT WASH LAUNDRY.

Clothing washed in rusty water can become stained. If this occurs, it is important to NOT dry the clothing. Instead, leave the wet clothing in the washer and apply an iron removal product as soon as possible to prevent the iron stain from setting. Please follow the manufacturer's instructions. It is important to note that when rusty water is experienced it is normally not a health concern but one of aesthetic quality.

Quality Assurance

Our plant operators perform 170 tests or more per day. Tests are done on both our source water, the Detroit River,

and our finished water before it goes out to our customers. In addition, our operators who live in Wyandotte bring in samples from their homes to test and make sure that the water in the system complies with regulations.

Tests include:

- Chlorine residual a disinfectant to remove pathogens
- Fluoride a chemical to help dental health
- Hardness measures dissolved minerals
- Phosphates a chemical that helps pipe integrity
- Ph measures the acidity of the water
- Alum helps to remove suspended solids
- Turbidity measures suspended solids
- Bacteria e coli, an indicator organism that can prove the presence of other bacteria

In addition to the above testing, our operators each perform "unknown sample" quality assurance / quality control testing during the year to ensure that the methodology we are using results in proper and repeatable outcomes. The laboratory equipment is checked on a daily basis and calibrated monthly. As needed, manufacturers perform full and traceable calibration on their equipment.

Our laboratory is certified by the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE), and is inspected every three (3) years by the EGLE. Personnel are certified and attend classes run by or accredited by the EGLE, which allows them to maintain and improve their certification.

Important Health Information

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immunocompromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants may be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. The U.S. EPA/CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by Cryptosporidium and other microbial contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline at (800) 426-4791 or http://water.epa.gov/drink/hotline

Substances That Could Be In Water

To ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the U.S. EPA prescribes regulations limiting the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. U.S. Food and Drug Administration regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water, which must provide the same protection for public health. Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of these contaminants does not necessarily indicate that the water poses a health risk.

Lead in Home Plumbing

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Infants and children who drink water containing lead could experience delays in their physical or mental development. Children could show slight deficits in attention span and learning abilities. Adults who drink this water over many years could develop kidney problems or high blood pressure. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and in-home plumbing. The Wyandotte Water Department is responsible for providing high quality drinking water but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you have a lead service line, it is recommended that you run your water for at least 5 minutes to flush water from both your home plumbing and the lead service line. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Lead Service Lines

Based on our current distribution system inventory, we have 693 lead water service lines out of a total of 10,512 water service lines.

UCMR4

We participated in the 4th stage of the U.S. EPA's Unregulated Contaminant Monitoring Rule (UCMR4) program by performing additional tests on our drinking water. UCMR4 sampling benefits the environment and public health by providing the U.S. EPA with data on the occurrence of contaminants suspected to be in the drinking water, in order to determine if U.S. EPA needs to introduce new regulatory standards to improve drinking water quality. Unregulated contaminant monitoring data are available to the public so please feel free to contact us if you are interested in obtaining that information. Source Water Assessment

A source water assessment has been completed for our water system. Our source water has a classification of high susceptibility to contamination. This susceptibility rating does not imply poor water quality; rather, it signifies the system's potential to become contaminated. 



ON Thomas is finding ways to reinvent underutilized properties for new purposes.

He created The Offices in Wyandotte, which includes two properties – one at First and Oak streets in 2019, and a second at 100 Maple in 2020. Small businesses that want flexible terms for quality workspace operate from these locations.

He recently opened a similar project called Better Space Shops and Storage at Pennsylvania and Biddle in Wyandotte, offering workshop and storage space for tradespeople like painters, plumbers, electricians and other skilled trades people.

"We solve real estate problems by creating properties that serve their communities," said Thomas, the owner and founder of RAV, a real estate development company that built and manages each of these properties.

"We focus on building the kinds of spaces that we ourselves want and need" he added. "If you have a large enough business to commit to a long-term lease or purchase of your own space that's great, but if you have a smaller or growing business then we create space for you."

Born out of necessity

Thomas grew up in Wyandotte, lives there and works in the community.

In 2005 he started his first business, Rise Above Entertainment, in the garage of his childhood home. At the time he was a 19-year-old touring professional BMX stunt





rider and the business was aimed at competing with his employer by producing the events he was hired to perform in.

Within a few years Rise Above Entertainment became the largest producer of BMX performances of its era. At its peak, it was producing around 1,000 performances per year across the United States.

"Eventually I outgrew my mom's garage" Thomas jokes.
"But then you find yourself in this position of needing more space but all the options are too costly or too much of a commitment. And so I thought – why don't I create the types of space that I want for my own business and figure out a way to make them economically accessible to other people like me?"

Through the process he learned that building, finance and economics are topics he enjoys, and that real estate development is where he wanted to be. In 2010 he returned to Wyandotte and began working in real estate on the side. From 2015 to 2019 Thomas began stepping away from events and started transitioning to full-time real estate development.

Today his company's primary focus is solving real estate related problems through a lens of economics, construction and finance.

"I like the challenging projects" he goes on, "the projects that may require a lot of work but that will also have a tangible impact on the community."





Maurino, Bears serve up outstanding 2023 season

YANDOTTE varsity tennis coach Joey Loselle likes to say, "you either win or you learn." Jackie Maurino and the Bears have done quite a bit of both during the 2023 season.

Only a junior, Maurino netted a first-place finish at the Division 2 Regional hosted by Wyandotte on May 18. She defeated Carlson's Adyson Brake 6-4, 6-4 in the finals at one singles and never lost a set in her three matches. The Bears finished second overall with 14 points, just two behind champion Trenton, and qualified for the D-2 State Finals.

"Our team has made huge improvements in all aspects of the game, especially considering the fact that we haven't made it to states as a team in five years," Maurino said. "I believe that the growth of companionship as a team has led to our success this year. I have never felt more connected to a team throughout the sports I've participated in."

Maurino said her goals coming into the season included what the Bears accomplished at regionals.

"My goals consisted of making it to states, taking a medal home from each tournament, as well as developing a strong bond with my coach and team," she said. "If I had to describe our team in one word, it would be determined. Since the start of the season, the team has made incredible progress that we knew we could reach with effort and consistency."

The team's performance at regionals was certainly one of the highlights. Other regional winners for the Bears included senior Ryley Tarnowski at three singles and junior Mia Spiteri and senior Scotlynn Vaughn at three doubles. Junior Ava Ball was second at two singles and senior Madison Rushlow was second at four singles.

"Scoring 14 points was a remarkable number to not only ourselves as players but our coach as well," Maurino said. "It couldn't have been done without the words of wisdom from our amazing coach, Joey Loselle. After our team breakfasts at Six Star, he gave a speech that resonated with all of us and encouraged us to play to our full potential."

Jackie, 17, is the daughter of Yvonne Maurino and Tommy Sabourin. She also nets a 4.07 GPA in the classroom. And she started playing tennis only three years ago.

"The thing I loved most about tennis when I began was the pure enjoyment I had just hitting a ball with a racket," she said. "There's just something so satisfying about hitting a good shot and the adrenaline rush you get during a point. Now, I practice about five-to-six days a week during the season, and about three-to-four days in the off season. I occasionally play in summer tournaments for fun and to meet new people."

Maurino played four singles as a freshman and moved up to two singles last year as a sophomore, when she racked up an 18-4 record and earned All-League honors. This season, she took a 20-5 record at one singles into the state finals.

She has already begun drawing up her future – which may or may not include tennis.

"After high school, I plan to attend college for a master's degree in architecture," she said. "I have not yet decided if I will continue playing tennis in college but I am considering it."

She also has one more season with the Bears to either win or learn.

UPDATE: At the Division 2 State Finals in Midland on June 2, Maurino lost her opening-round match to Midland's Riley Penwell 6-2, 6-4. The state finals were ultimately won by Birmingham Seaholm.



LIST OF INSURANCE PLANNING MISTAKES -AND HOW TO FIX THEM

hile acknowledging David Letterman as the master of the Top Ten List, the following is my own Top Ten List of insurance planning mistakes and how to fix them:

NAMING YOUR ESTATE AS BENEFICIARY

If you name your estate as the beneficiary, the probate court is involved, guaranteeing a time-consuming, public and expensive process. Consider establishing a Revocable Trust and naming the Trust as the primary beneficiary for probate avoidance, privacy, simplicity and potential tax savings.

• NAMING AN EX-SPOUSE AS BENEFICIARY

While an obvious mistake, old insurance policies often designate an ex-spouse or other person that no longer has a relationship with the policy owner. In order to rectify this, a review of your current beneficiary arrangement is important. Consider establishing a Trust and maintaining your Trust beneficiaries in a manner that reflects your current wishes.

• NAMING A MINOR CHILD AS BENEFICIARY

If you name a minor child (under age 18) as a beneficiary, the insurance company will require a conservator appointed to process the claim and receive the death benefit. A conservatorship is a probate court process that is public, costly and time consuming. There will be annual work (and expense) until your beneficiary attains age 18. Upon attaining age 18, your now adult beneficiary receives the money and is free to spend it as he sees fit. Consider a Trust to receive the death benefit and design appropriate payout provisions. Your Successor Trustee would supervise distributions of the insurance proceeds to your beneficiary for education and health needs and distribute the balance to your beneficiary at age 30 (for example).

• NAMING A "DISABLED PERSON" AS BENEFICIARY

This error could jeopardize government benefits available for your beneficiary. Instead, provide the insurance proceeds to your Trust with appropriate provisions to maintain government benefits for your beneficiary.

OWNING A POLICY ON AN ADULT CHILD

If you own a policy, and someone else is the insured, and you die first, the insurance policy must go through probate to have a new owner on the policy. Consider either transferring the ownership to the adult child, or in the alternative, transfer the ownership of the policy to your Trust.

OWNING A LARGE LIFE INSURANCE POLICY IN YOUR OWN NAME

The death benefit on an insurance policy owned by you will be counted in your gross estate for Federal Estate Tax purposes. If you do not own the policy, then the death benefit is not included in your taxable estate. If necessary, establish an Insurance Trust to own the policy and



distribute the proceeds to your heirs at death completely tax free.

CASHING IN A LIFE INSURANCE POLICY WHEN YOU ARE UNINSURABLE

The rule is that you do not cash in a life insurance policy if you cannot get insurance. This simply benefits the insurance company and hurts your family.

CASHING IN A LIFE INSURANCE POLICY WITHOUT CONSIDERING THE TAX CONSEQUENCES

If you cash in a life insurance policy, any gain on the cash value of the policy will be taxed as income to you upon receipt. Consider transferring the cash value into a more cost-effective insurance policy or an annuity.

SURRENDERING A LARGE POLICY WITHOUT CHECKING THE LIFE SETTLEMENT MARKET

Traditionally, a policy owner could only surrender the policy if he no longer wanted to maintain it. Now, if the policy is large enough, a private market exists where a third party might purchase the life insurance policy for a far greater amount than the surrender value. This creates substantial opportunity if you no longer wish to maintain your current insurance program.

FAILING TO REVIEW YOUR LIFE INSURANCE POLICY ON A REGULAR BASIS

Life insurance plays a critical part in your financial and estate planning. Your current life insurance program should reflect your current needs and goals. Review your life insurance regularly with your financial planner and estate planning attorney to accomplish your goals in the most cost-effective and tax efficient manner.


