As Spokesperson for the McKinley Neighbors United neighborhood group, I would like to voice our support for the idea proposed by David and Martha Beaudrie for the City to purchase the railroad-owned property east of the railroad tracks between Orchard Street and Forest Street for the purpose of continuing the berm and pine tree planting southward to Forest Street. Although McKinley Neighbors United is very happy that a berm consistent with the Master Plan has been constructed, it stops just south of the centerline extension of Orchard Street at the tracks. The berm provides no protection from the industrial noise pollution the neighbors on 9th Street south of the Orchard Street centerline are exposed to on a constant basis from the railroad traffic, Cadon Plating, and other industries operating in the area.

As you recall, the Beaudrie's initial communication to Mayor and City Council, dated November 5, 2009, was referred to the City Engineer at the November 9, 2009 City Council meeting for review and report back. The City Engineer reported at the February 4, 2010 City Council meeting that Ms. Linda Armbruster, Manager of Business Development and Real Estate for CN Railroad has yet to respond back to inquiries from the City Engineer's office.

It is the hope of the McKinley Neighbors United neighborhood group that the City Engineer will be persistent in his efforts to review our concerns and proposals with the appropriate CN Railroad representatives, and that an appropriate real estate transaction can be closed this year.

Dear Mayor Peterson and City Council Members,

The Downriver Council for the Arts (DCA), the tenant and operator of the Wyandotte Arts Center, has requested that the City apply for a liquor license under section MCL 436.1509 for 81 Chestnut or for the DCA as the concessionaire of the facility. The section of the law reads as follows:

436.1509 Liquor licenses; municipal civic center or civic auditorium; conditions and limitations.

Sec. 509.

The commission may issue, without regard to the quota provisions of section 531, licenses to a commission, board, or authority, governing or operating any municipal civic center or civic auditorium or to 1 or more of its concessionaires, or to both, if the center or auditorium is within a city or township having a population of not less than 9,500, if the center or auditorium is owned and operated as a municipal enterprise and if the legislative body of the municipality first authorizes the operating authority of the civic center or civic auditorium or its concessionaire to apply to the commission for a license. Licenses issued under this section shall not be transferable, shall not be issued to an educational institution or for a facility operated in connection with an educational institution, and shall authorize the sale of alcoholic liquor only in connection with a scheduled event at the licensed premises.

This license is the same license obtained for use by the Yack Arena.

The undersigned is recommending that the City Council authorize the DCA to apply for this license as the concessionaire of the facility.

Dear Mayor Peterson and City Council Members,

At the City Council meeting dated October 18, 2009, the City Council passed the following resolution relative to placing a police officer in the DRANO unit:

RESOLVED by the City Council that the communication from the Chief of Police dated October 15, 2009 regarding an assignment to the DRANO unit is received and placed on file;

AND FURTHER, authorizes the placement of an officer in the DRANO unit contingent on the receipt of \$120,000 in grant funding and

FURTHER, authorizes the hiring of a new patrol officer contingent on the execution of a memorandum of understanding by the union relative to retroactive application of changes in the collective bargaining agreement to newly hired employees and

FURTHER, any employment offer should indicate that this new position may be eliminated from the budget if the financial projections presented by the Chief of Police are not met or if staffing levels are not sufficient to absorb this employee at the end of the employment period which the grant subsidy applies.

At a meeting of the City's Budget Committee that was held on January 11, 2010, City Council recommended the implementation of twenty-one (21) recommendations prepared by the Mayor and the Finance Department. These recommendations were approved at the City Council meeting dated January 25, 2010. One of these recommendations was to delay the hiring of the aforementioned patrol officer and use the grant funds received for DRANO participation to defray other costs in the police department. Although the assignment to DRANO has reduced the number of police officers assigned to regular shifts in the City of Wyandotte, it has not impaired the ability to provide substantially the same level of service to our citizens.

Since the time of those recommendations, the City Council has been advised that property tax revenues are estimated to fall by up to 9.77% or \$958,000 (see attached email dated March 10, 2010 @ 9:32 AM) for the 2011 FY. The Finance Department is currently awaiting the tax valuations by tax increment district from the City Assessor to calculate the actual property tax revenue loss.

As such, this correspondence serves to recommend that the City Council officially cease the process to hire a new patrol officer. In light of the severe financial conditions facing the operation of the City, it is not prudent or responsible to add headcount at this time. Additionally, the process of establishing an eligibility list for hiring is costly and time-consuming. The next steps in establishing this list involve formal testing and background checks of applicants. It is the recommendation of the undersigned to avoid these tasks due to the unlikelihood of being able to afford the new employee at this time.

Enclosed please find two (2) Grant Applications for the Waterways Grant Program to be incorporated into the public hearing being held on Monday, March 22, 2010. Application #1 includes cost for additional environmental dredging and Application #2 does not include this cost. The total project cost for Application #1 is \$2,865,000.00. The City's commitment will be 50% or \$1,432,500. Application #2 is \$2,800,000 and the City's commitment will be 40% or \$1,120,000. Application #2 assumes the City will receive a grant for \$560,000 to provide environmental dredging.

I have also enclosed a Resolution for your consideration.

This project is consistent with the Goals and Objectives identified in the City of Wyandotte's Strategic Plan 2010-2015 that identifies a commitment to our heritage, economic development and the wise use of our riverfront.

NEEDS ASSESSMENT

In Summary, Bishop Park is located adjacent to Wyandotte's Central Business District (CBD). Although the CBD is attractive with many special events such as 3rd Friday happenings, Annual Street Art Fair and other special events it struggles to fill empty buildings. When National Chain Restaurants or Stores consider locating in Wyandotte their first concern is always that Wyandotte does not have 360' attraction because of the Detroit River. A transient marina is needed to avoid this perception and attract visitors to Wyandotte. The conveniently located restaurants and stores are one block from Bishop Park and will welcome visitors using the transient marina. The transient marina is needed to keep Wyandotte's CBD economically viable. The marina will also serve as a safe haven for boaters during stormy weather.

The City of Wyandotte has as a Strategic Plan, which in its Vision Statement for the Riverfront Development states:

"Wyandotte's riverfront is its most attractive natural feature of the City. Substantial development along this riverfront has enhanced it as a dining, recreational and entertainment destination. A downtown riverfront marina provides access to the downtown area as a destination.

The City has taken steps to implement the redevelopment of property in the CBD. Sixty (60) new single family condominiums have been constructed adjacent to Bishop Park. The City has completed a 5 Phase streetscape project in the downtown. This includes a walkway from Biddle Avenue, major thoroughfare through Wyandotte to the Detroit River. These walkways will enable pedestrians to walk safely from the River to the shops on Biddle Avenue.

Also, included in the Transient Marina Study at Bishop Park, prepared by JJR, LLC is a Market Feasibility Evaluation.

Al Bates, Second Step, 66 Sycamore, supports the marina, take advantage of the water front.

Allen Kuderik, 494 North Drive, the dock infringes fishing, objects to the marina because it will impede fishing.
