Dear Honorable Mayor and Council Persons,

I am compelled to write this letter because of a statement Fire Chief Mike McDonald made a couple of weeks ago. He said that he has not received many complaints about the fires people are using in their yards for entertainment. We all know why people are not complaining. We don't want to offend our neighbors. I don't either, but this is not about offending my neighbors, it is about doing what is right.

This is not about whether or not people like to sit before a lovely fire and dream as they look into the flames, or the embers. It is not about moving family conversations from the dining room table to the back yard. It is not even about people like myself who is a severe Asthmatic and has to close our windows on beautiful fresh air evenings because there are fires on three sides of us.

This issue is about what is the Ordinance in the City, or the County. The issue is about what these fires are doing to our Air.

Many years ago an Ordinance was passed by someone who said the air was becoming too polluted and we needed to do something about it. Those of us who had gas incinerators in our basement unhooked them, put them in the trash, bought garbage disposals, disposed of our fall leaves and other trash in an appropriate manner and did not grumble. We did it because that was going to help save this Earth and the Air surrounding it for future generations.

About eighteen years ago the Fire Department showed up next door to us where a new home was being built to tell the builder he must put out the fire he had built to get rid of left over wood. Do you think that maybe the Fire Department knew at that time there was an Ordinance banning that fire? I checked with the County on-line today and that is still in effect. I don't see the difference between burning left over wood from builders and burning wood in the fire pits of ordinary citizens.

It is time for someone to find the Ordinance that was put into place about air pollution. (30+ years if you're looking for paperwork) It is time for the Council to stand up for what is right and help keep this air from killing us all. If there really is not an ordinance banning fires in the back yards then the rest of us who are not happy with the constant smoke will have no option than to shut the windows and then shut our mouths.

At the June 7, 2010 Council meeting, I was directed to investigate any additional laws pertaining to open burning and report back.

I have reviewed Wayne County ordinances and was unable to locate any ordinance that directly speaks to an open burning ban in the County. I did find references that it is not permissible in Wayne County to burn trash, grass clippings and brush as a means of disposal. I have also reviewed the City of Wyandotte ordinances and the only reference to open burning is included in:

Article II. Air Pollution Sec. 30.1-23. Air Contaminant or water vapor or discharge of smoke, dust, etc.; when prohibited; restrictions.

(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of any other city ordinance or rule, a person shall not cause or permit the emission of an air contaminant or water vapor in quantities that cause, alone or in reaction with other air contaminants, either of the following:

1. Injurious effects to human health or safety, animal life, plant life of significant economic value, or property in the City of Wyandotte.
2. Unreasonable interference with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property in the City of Wyandotte.

(b) No person shall, cause, suffer or allow to be discharged or emitted from any fuel-burning equipment, internal combustion engine, vehicle, outside open fire, or premises, any air contaminant or water vapor or any combination thereof or other solid or gaseous product of combustion in violation of subsection (a) above.

A violation of this section of the City Ordinances would constitute a nuisance and allows the Fire Department to extinguish the fire and the Police Department to cite an individual for an ordinance violation as outlined in:

NUISANCES Sec. 24-2. The maintaining, using, placing, depositing, leaving or permitting to be or remain on any public or private property of any of the following items, conditions or actions are hereby declared to be and constitute a nuisance; provided, however, this enumeration shall not be deemed or construed to be conclusive, limiting or restrictive;

(11) Dense smoke, noxious fumes, gas, soot or cinders, in unreasonable quantities.

The Fire Department receives very few complaints annually with regards to open burning but does take any citizen complaint very serious when we are called. It is my experience that many of these complaints are based on neighborhood disputes and not legitimate medical conditions. I am very cognizant of the fact that there are residents which have issues with opening burning, whether it is medically related or simply the dislike of the smell of burning wood but it is extremely difficult to enforce an outright ban due to the sheer number of these outdoor fire pits in our City.

It is my recommendation that we continue to follow the established Fire Pit guidelines to hopefully minimize any complaints, a copy is attached for your review, and I will monitor this issue closely.

In closing, I would ask all City of Wyandotte residents to please give every consideration to your neighbors while enjoying the outdoors.

Dear Mayor Peterson and City Council Members,

The Wayne County Board of Public Works has submitted the sewage disposal rates effective July 1, 2010, for approval by the Wayne County Commission. The proposed rates represent an imputed increase of 7.68% from the prior year's rate.

In order to meet current City obligations, the following sewage rate per million gallons is being recommended:

Operation and Maintenance	\$1,471.73
Debt Service	843.47
Replacement	280.07
Meter Loss	43.23
Collection Cost	<u>50.50</u>
Total	<u><u>\$2,689.00</u></u>

The proposed sewage rate includes a 5.30% rate increase over the current sewage rate of \$2,554.00/million gallons. The rate increase is primarily necessitated by increased debt service requirements relating to the approved capital improvement projects at the treatment facility. Including this proposed rate increase, the average annual rate increase since 1997 is 4.84%.

Note that the necessary sewage rate increase was 17.30% based on necessary capital improvements in the local sewage collection system. A request has been made of the Tax Increment Finance Authority (TIFA) to fund approximately \$500,000 in capital improvement costs in the TIFA district (see attached letter). This meeting is scheduled for June 22. An adjustment in the revised rate may be necessary at the final reading of the ordinance based on the results of this meeting.

Please note on Attachment B that the increase in sewage rate is estimated to cost the average homeowner \$1.08 per month or \$12.96 per year. The proposed sewage rate would continue to place the City of Wyandotte as the second lowest sewage rate out of the thirteen communities that utilize the Wyandotte Wastewater Treatment Plant (Attachment C). Also, enclosed on Attachment D is the conversion calculation from million cubic feet to million gallons.

Dear Chairman Mix and Commission Members,

In accordance with the settlement of the Consent Decree that resulted from violations of the Clean Water Act by the Downriver Sewage Disposal System, the City of Wyandotte has been required to follow a maintenance plan for our sewer system. An element of this plan is the inspection of all sewer lines a minimum of once every ten (10) years. The resulting inspections have shown a significant amount of necessary repairs that needs to be made in the section of the city which was inspected last year.

Based on the results of the bid opening on June 16, 2010, and additional possible cured in place (CIP) rehabilitation, the estimated cost of these repairs is approximately \$500,000. These repairs alone would necessitate an increase in the sewage rate of 12.75%. The sewage rate already needs to be increased 3.35% for debt incurred for capital improvements at the Wyandotte Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) and 1.20% for increased treatment costs and lower volume of water usage.

Even though I know that these capital improvements are a necessity and crucial to preventing instances of sewer backups in our resident's basements, I am having a difficult time supporting a 17.3% increase in sewer costs for our residents. Thus, I am requesting that the Tax Increment Financing Authority (TIFA) support the funding of these sewer repairs.

Infrastructure improvements have always been an important component of the TIFA's initiatives. Public buildings, roads, and water mains have been improved with the funding assistance of this board. But, this correspondence represents the first request to this board for funding city-wide sewer repairs, although I am aware that sewer improvements have been funded for new developments. Note that all of the repairs that have been identified are located within the consolidated TIFA district.

I have always supported the neighborhood revitalization program that has historically been the most important initiative pursued by this board. We have traditionally budgeted \$3 million annually for this purpose, and I am aware that we are already reducing this amount to provide for the matching funds necessary for the transient marina. But, with the receipt of over \$8 million of federal funding over the next three (3) years that will be used to purchase, demolish, and build residential houses in the TIFA district, I believe that spending a portion of TIFA's financial resources on the infrastructure that supports these residents is crucial right now.

Thus, I am requesting that this board commit to providing \$500,000 in funding for sewer repairs in the next budget. I am aware that this will reduce the amount available for property acquisition, the federal funding mentioned above more than compensates for the funds that will be allocated to improving the infrastructure that supports these neighborhoods. This will also help our residents by keeping the increase in sewer rate to a more manageable amount.

I thank you for considering this request and trust that you will continue with your stellar track record of doing the right thing for our citizens and community.
