Call for Election Worker Applicants

Qualifications

- Must be 16 years of age or older.
- Must be a registered voter in the State of Michigan.
- Must complete and file an **Election Inspector Application**. The applicant must list a political party affiliation (not independent) on the application.
- Must attend a **MANDATORY** training session prior to working as an election inspector.
- Must have no felony or election fraud convictions.

Precinct Election Inspector Boards

- Inspectors are appointed from those who have properly completed and filed an application with the City of Wyandotte City Clerk and have attended a training session.
- An inspector cannot be a candidate, challenger, or member of the Board of Canvassers.
- A member of a candidate's immediate family cannot serve as an election inspector.

Election Day Requirements

- The polling place must be open for voting between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.
- A majority of the board must be in attendance at the polling place at all times during the election. For example, if the board consists of four inspectors, at least three must remain on duty at all times. A member of the election board can leave to eat or vote (with the Chairperson's approval) as long as his/her absence does not interrupt the orderly operation of the polling place and a majority of the board is still present.
- Election inspectors must report for work at the time set by the City of Wyandotte City Clerk, usually around 6:00 a.m.
- After the polls close at 8:00 p.m., election inspectors must prepare the election materials that are delivered to City Hall by the Chairperson. The rest of the supplies and equipment must also be stored before leaving the polling place.

Current Pay Rate

- Inspectors receive \$150 for Election Day.
- Chairpersons receive \$200 for Election Day.

* A "known active advocate" of another political party is defined to mean a person who 1) is a delegate to the convention or an officer of another party; 2) is affiliated with another party through an elected or appointed government position or; 3) has made documented public statements specifically supporting by name another political party or its candidates in the same calendar year as the election at which the person will serve as an inspector. "Documented public statements" means statements reported by the news media or written statements with a clear and unambiguous attribution to the applicant.
