**BACKGROUND:** As a part of our 2014 fiscal year planning, the Downtown Development Authority will undertake the project of Strategic Planning.

As you are aware, the DDA currently has an operating budget of \$485,875.00. A significant portion of this budget (\$191,072.00) is currently earmarked toward projects and initiatives which the DDA has elected to pay for over the course of a period of time: Downtown Streetscape Projects, Hornby purchase, Fogel purchase and the Wyandotte Arts Center project. Beginning Fiscal Year 2015 and beyond a large portion of these debt commitments will be met. This will leave the DDA with a greater percentage of revenue for development, projects and initiatives Downtown.

The proposed DDA Strategic Plan will identify initiatives and project priorities, outline strategies to accomplish these priorities, and identify potential funding sources for future initiatives for the next 5 years and beyond.

**STRATEGIC PLAN/GOALS:** The Proposed DDA Strategic Plan will further reinforce the City's Strategic Plan and Wyandotte's commitment to revitalize the downtown with new developments and to make our downtown a destination of choice for residents throughout Southeast Michigan.





- 1. Police/Security and Fire Protection: The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (LLS) will hire two armed security guards to secure our accounting and registration areas. Additional security for crowd control will be staffed by trusted LLS volunteers and staff.
- Food, water, and electrical supply facilities: Various vendors will set up on premises to provide complimentary food and beverages to participants. LLS does request use of the electrical outlets installed throughout the park.
- 3. Health and sanitation facilities: We would like the use of the bathroom facilities in the park.
- Medical facilities and services: In the event of an emergency, 911 will be used. Other medical issues that require immediate attention will be directed to the Wyandotte hospital.
- 5. Vehicle access and parking facilities: Participants will use the public parking areas around the event location.
- 6. Camping and trailer facilities: N/A
- 7. Illumination facilities: We will use the available lighting on the streets and in the park. We will also plug in portable lights for some tents set up in the park, through the use of generators and/or electrical outlets throughout the park.
- 8. Communication: A LLS staff person will be available and on site at all times to communicate with the city or other official dignitaries.
- 9. Facilities for clean up and waste disposal: Staff and volunteers will provide clean up of the walk route, as well as the event area, beginning at approximately 9:00 p.m. Disposable trash containers will be distributed throughout the event area. A dumpster is requested for event debris.



#### ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

#### ACCESS TO VENUE

Purchaser shall allow artist access to venue for load in and setup at least three (3) hours prior to opening doors. Tangerine Moon Productions will advance exact times. Purchaser must also provide parking. 6 parking spaces for cars and one large U-haul truck sized vehicle for the sound company (If needed), as close to stage doors as possible. If parking is off the premises, then purchaser shall validate all parking or have passes made available for all production members. *TMP Production members will be reimbursed for parking by client should parking not be made available.* 

#### VENUE CHANGE

If a change in venue occurs after the agreement has been made, purchaser may be subject to an additional \$500 fee, if it is deemed necessary for movers to be hired at said new venue. Including (but not limited to): stairs, extreme inclines, or otherwise difficult load-in scenarios.

#### STAGING

Purchaser shall provide an appropriate size stage, (20 X 24 recommended). Stage area MUST fit five (5) people comfortably. If performance is outdoors, the stage shall be covered, and proper indoor facilities are necessary for backup plans due to inclement weather.

#### TECHNICAL

If Tangerine Moon Productions is providing P.A., multimedia, and lighting, purchaser must provide adequate electrical power. 2-3 separate circuits if lighting is not purchased, and 4 separate circuits if lighting and multimedia packages are purchased.

#### SOUNDCHECK

Artist needs twenty-five (25) to forty (40) minutes to sound check. Tangerine Moon Productions will advance exact times.

#### SECURITY

Purchaser shall provide security (amount appropriate to venue size) to ensure the safety of the audience as well as the artists, crew and equipment from the time we arrive until the time we leave.

#### DRESSING ROOMS

\* Purchaser shall provide a clean, quiet, well lit, NON SMOKING room for artist to sit six (6) people comfortably from load in to load out. This room should have multiple electrical outlets. This room shall be lockable if needed. Purchaser shall also provide access to a clean, private bathroom with soap.

#### SPECIAL NOTE

The artist shall at all times have complete supervision, direction, and control over the services or his/her personnel and reserves the right to control the manner, means, and deteils of the performance to ensure Tangerine Moon Productions "show quality standards".

Recording, reproduction, or transmission of artist's performance is prohibited absent written consent of the artist.

Items marked with an \* are preferred, not necessarily required provisions.

#### Cancellation:

The agreement that the Artist perform is subject to detention by sickness, accident, riot, strikes, epidemic, acts of God or other legitImate conditions beyond the artists control.

Outdoor events are also subject to cancellation resulting from specific weather conditions such as (but not limited to) precipitation (or strong chance of), adverse wet conditions due to prior weather conditions, lightning (or strong chance of), or not being provided adequate shelter from the elements.

If the circumstance should arise that the purchaser cancels the performance agreement, all deposits will be foregone.

#### Extra Time:

Tangerine Moon Productions' bands will play up to three encore songs if requested. After that the purchaser shall be billed for one set which Is equal to the purchase price divided by three. This payment is to be paid within one week after the contracted performance date.

#### Late Charges:

There is a weekly late charge of \$25 dollars per production.

#### INDEMNIFICATION

Purchaser agrees to indemnity and hold harmless, the Artist and Tangenine Moon Productions from, and against all claims, costs, damages, liabilities, losses or judgments arising out of, or in connection to any claim, demand or action made by any third party as sustained by direct or indirect consequence of this engagement.

All changes to this contract/rider must be in writing, and approved by both the artist and the purchaser. Unless waived, all terms and provisions herein shall be agreed to, and provided by purchaser.

#### LEGAL STUFF

#### CHOICE OF LAW

This Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Michigan.

#### ATTORNEY FEES AND COSTS

If payment due under this Contract is not timely made by Purchaser, then Tangerine Moon Productions shall be entited to recover, in addition to the payment itself and any late fees specified in this Contract, any and all reasonable costs and attorney fees incurred in connection with the collection of the delinquent payment(s).

#### ARBITRATION

All disputes related to this Contract, to the performance or alleged breach thereof, or to non-payment or delinquency of monles due under the terms of this Contract, shall be submitted to arbitration before a single-member arbitration panel, under the Commercial Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association. If an arbitrator cannot be agreed-upon within ten (10) days of the arbitration demand, then either party may seek appointment of an arbitrator under Rule 11 of the Commercial Arbitration Rules. The Arbitral Award shall require the substantially losing party in said arbitration to pay both the substantially prevailing party's reasonable costs and attorney faes, and the entire cost of arbitration. The Arbitral Award shall be subject to enforcement in any United States state or federal court of competent jurisdiction. The party enforcing the Arbitral Award shall be entitled to recover all reasonable costs and attorney fees incurred in connection with the enforcement of said Award.

#### ENTIRE AGREEMENT

The following are the terms entered this  $\underline{34}$  day  $\underline{Feb}$  of 2014 for an agreement between the City of Wyandotte and Lori Oberlin, doing business as Lori's Festive Catering. Lori's Festive Catering agrees to maintain the shared Street Art Fair / Non profit lemonade drink stands at the 2014 Wyandotte Street Art Fair, July 9<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup>, as follows.

# RESPONSIBILITIES OF LORI'S FESTIVE CATERING:

- Procure all necessary supplies Lemons, sugar, cups, straws, ice and latex gloves
- Five Lemonade Stands Tent set-ups, with hand-washing facilities and approved by the Wayne County Health Department
- Filing of all Wayne County Health Department licenses (Phone 734-727-7400) and stands will be ready for inspection prior to the Art Fair opening
- Insurance of \$1,000,000.00 Liability Policy (See below)
- Training of workers and leaders utilized by non-profit organizations in June at a location provided by the City
- Supply all location leaders
- All lemonade signage including those announcing the participating non profits
- Lori's Festive catering shall supply T-shirts (uniforms) and hats for volunteers up to 100 shirts.
- All areas area must be cleaned daily to eliminate trash, and trash related problems.

### RESPONSIBILITIES OF CITY OF WYANDOTTE:

- Supply of workers for the Lemonade Stands each day from one hour before to one hour after each daily event
- Building, for housing of supplies with an area of approximately 10 by 20 feet (if requested)
- Five Great Lemonade locations 15' by 15' areas for tent, customer and room for display
- Hook-Ups for potable water, 110 electricity for five booths two outlets each letter to be given to Lori's Festive Catering Staff prior to event that will be used to approve the use of electrical hook up
- One parking space for stock trailer for the four days of the fair. The location of this space(s) will be negotiated prior to the event. Said space will allow for 110 volt electrical hook up.

On June 17, 2013, the City Council directed the City Engineer to prepare plans and estimated costs to construct a parking lot on City owned property at 2441 Fort Street, with the recommendation that a Special Assessment District encompassing the business district be created to pay for the parking lot construction. On October 14, 2013, the City Council approved the sale of the north one (1) foot of property to the owner of 2433 Fort Street. This resolution included a \$2,000.00 reduction of any future assessment for the construction of a public parking lot if the owner bricked the south wall of the building.

Chapter XIV, Subdivision 2, Section 8, of the City Charter indicates that when the owners of sixty (60) per centum of the frontage of lands, liable to be assessed in any special assessment district, shall petition the Council for any public improvement, the Council shall order such improvement to be made. In other cases public improvements shall be made at the discretion of the Council. The approximate estimated cost of this project is \$35,000.00, all of which would be assessable.

The Department of Legal Affairs has prepared the necessary resolution setting a hearing of necessity to proceed with the public improvements.

# STRATEGIC PLAN/GOALS:

This proposed improvement is consistent with the Goals and Objectives of the City of Wyandotte Strategic Plan in providing infrastructure improvements for the stability and expansion of commercial property on Fort Street.

# **ACTION REQUESTED:**

Determine that the construction of a public parking lot is a necessary and beneficial public improvement and adopt the prepared resolution for the creating of a special assessment district and setting the time and date for a public hearing.

## CITY OF WYANDOTTE ORDAINS:

## Section 1. Amendment.

The following Section of the City of Wyandotte Zoning Ordinance entitled Article XXIV – General Provisions, Section 2408 Signs, Section (F) Permitted Signs by Zoning District Sub-Section 1 (h) concerning attention-getting devices in the CDB Central Business District shall be amended to read:

(h) Attention getting devices including searchlights, balloons, banners (provided payment of the required fee for the banner is made, and the banner may not be placed on outdoor café enclosures) and similar devices or ornamentation designed for purposes of attracting attention, promotions or advertising, are allowable. A banner or multiple banners, shall be allowed on each street, parking lot or alley side of the building, and shall not exceed 24 square feet in area per banner or 24 square feet total for all banners on each side of building, except only one (1) banner shall be allowed on the front of the building and shall not exceed 24 square feet in area. All banners and signs cannot exceed 10% of the wall area. A maximum two (2) banners on any wall, except the front wall, and no more than five (5) banners shall be allowed at one time.

Attention-getting devices except banners as described above shall be allowed for up to three (3) separate thirty (30) day periods in a calendar year.

Feather Banners are not permitted.

## Section 2. Amendment.

The following Section of the City of Wyandotte Zoning Ordinance entitled Article XXIV – General Provisions, Section 2408 Signs, Section (F) Permitted Signs by Zoning District Sub-Section 2 (j)(1) concerning attention-getting devices in the O-S, B-1 and B-2 Districts following shall be amended to read:

1. Attention getting devices including searchlights, balloons, banners (provided payment of the required fee for the banner is made, and the banner may not be placed on outdoor café enclosures) and similar devices or ornamentation designed for purposes of attracting attention, promotions or advertising, are allowable. A banner or multiple banners, shall be allowed on each street, parking lot or alley side of the building, and shall not exceed 24 square feet in area per banner or 24 square feet total for all banners on each side of building, except only one (1) banner shall be allowed on the front of the building and shall not exceed 24 square feet in area. All banners and signs cannot exceed 10% of the wall area. A maximum two (2) banners on any wall, except the front wall, and no more than five (5) banners shall be allowed at one time.

Attention-getting devices except banners as described above shall be allowed for up to three (3) separate thirty (30) day periods in a calendar year.

Feather Banners are not permitted.

## Section 3. Severability.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall be published along with the notice of adoption in a newspaper generally circulated in the City of Wyandotte within ten (10) days after adoption and shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its adoption or seven (7) days after publication whichever is later. The notice of adoption shall include the text of the amendment, the effective date of the Ordinance, and the place and time where a copy of the Ordinance may be purchased or inspected.

**BACKGROUND:** The City offers residents to rent 96 gallon toters for \$48 for a two (2) year term. On February 1, 2014, the City's new ordinance regarding the use of a metal, durable plastic, or an approved container of equal material to be used for the collection of solid waste will be effective. Therefore, the demand for leasing toters has increased. The Department of Public Service (DPS) desires to purchase an additional 144 toters from Cascade Engineering of Grand Rapids, Michigan to meet this demand. Cascade Engineering has supplied the previous carts to the City. The cost of 6,730.56 (144 x 46.74) to purchase these toters will be funded from the Solid Waste Fund.
