Dear Mr. Look:

You have contacted me in regard to the above-referenced Class Action Complaint (the "Complaint") filed by the County of Wayne against the City of Wyandotte, the Tax Increment Finance Authority of the City of Wyandotte; the Downtown Development Authority for the City of Wyandotte; and the Brownfield Redevelopment Authority for the City of Wyandotte (collectively, "Wyandotte"). More particularly, you have asked if we would assume the defense of the Wyandotte entities in the litigation. We would be pleased to do so. This letter will set forth the background of the matter and the terms of our engagement.

The Complaint arises out of a judgment entered against Wayne County on May 29, 2015, in the amount of \$49,965 plus \$10,595 in interest per day in favor of the Wayne County Retirement Board. The County made a payment of \$10,000,000 toward the judgment. On June 12, 2015 the County submitted a judgment levy of 0.09761 mills (the "Judgment Levy") to all taxing authorities in Wayne County as a supplement to the 2015 Tax Rate Request. The Judgment Levy authorized the taxing authority to levy and collect from each property owner within the County a portion of the judgment. Thereafter, an issue arose between Wayne County and the Wayne County communities and their respective tax increment finance authority's ("TIFs") as to whether or not the Judgment Levy constituted "tax increment revenue" subject to capture by the TIF authorities. Wyandotte and other communities in Wayne County have taken the position that the Judgment Levy is subject to capture as tax increment revenue.

On October 30, 2015, the County filed the above-referenced Complaint against Wyandotte seeking, *inter alia*, recovery of all revenue raised under the Judgment Levy and

enjoining Wyandotte and the class from capturing any portion of the revenue on behalf of its TIF authorities. The Complaint alledges that Wyandotte is a representative defendant of all other Wayne County municipalities and TIF authorities similarly situated. The Complaint further alleges that the representative defendants (Wyandotte) have competent counsel experienced in the intricacies of tax increment financings and are adequate representatives and will fairly and adequately protect the interests of the class. Wyandotte has not sought this designation and at this time we do not know the basis for the allegation.

Our office has expertise in regard to the legal basis for the capture of tax increment revenues. In 2013, we filed a complaint for declaratory judgment on behalf of the Wayne County communities in Wayne County Circuit Court. At that time, we represented approximately 19 Wayne County communities and their respective TIF entities (including Wyandotte) seeking a declaratory judgment that the millages levied by the Wayne County Zoological Authority and the Wayne County Art Institute Authority were subject to capture as tax increment revenues. On June 12, 2013, Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Daniel P. Ryan issued an Opinion and Order, which affirmed the right of the Wayne County communities and their TIF authorities to capture the zoo millage and the art millage. The Circuit Court also dismissed the counterclaims it sought recovery of the tax increment revenues against the Wayne County communities and their TIF authorities. A subsequently Claim of Appeal ultimately withdrawn by the taxing authorities.

We have examined the legal issues relating to the capture of the Judgment Levy as tax increment revenue. It is our opinion that the Judgment Levy millage is subject to capture by existing TIF entities in accordance with their specific authorizing statutes on the same basis as other ad valorem property tax levies. Of course, our judgment is a matter of opinion and should not be construed as a warranty or guarantee as to the outcome of this action.

We are prepared to defend Wyandotte and its TIF entities in regard to the above-referenced Complaint. Our legal services will include preparation of pleadings, papers and briefs to be filed in Wayne County Circuit Court seeking a declaratory judgment with regard to the rights and obligation in regard to capture of the Judgment Levy. We also intend to contest the allegation that Wyandotte should bear the burden and expense of being the representative defendant among the entire class of Wayne County municipalities, local treasurers, and TIF authorities. To the extent that other Wayne County municipalities and their TIF authorities are interested, and upon consultation and approval of Wyandotte, we will seek a joint defense of this matter among other municipalities and TIF authorities and a common sharing of expenses.

The terms of our engagement will be that we will provide legal services on an hourly basis and invoice Wyandotte monthly. All invoices are due and payable upon receipt. I will offer a discounted government hourly rate in this matter of \$275 per hour. We will utilize other associates at a lower rate, when appropriate. In addition to the hourly fee, we charge clients for such disbursements as print charges (copies), filing fees, mileage, deposition transcript charges,

postage, courier fees, and such other incidental charges that arise in litigation. At this time we would suggest a contract amount not to exceed \$25,000.

For purposes of administrative convenience, we will send our invoices to the Wyandotte City Treasurer for payment with a courtesy copy to your office. Thereafter, to the extent that the City and its TIFs may desire to internally allocate expenses among the TIFs that can be done administratively by the City and its TIF entities. It is our practice to keep our clients fully advised of all developments and we will of course do so in this action.

If the terms of this engagement meet with your approval, please have the appropriate individual sign the acknowledgement below and return an original signed agreement to my attention and a copy via e-mail. We will prepare and file our responsive pleading upon receipt of the signed engagement letter. We look forward to working with your office on this matter.
